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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 29, 1937, increased 1,416,901 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 79,024,927 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 74,483,913 bushels compared with 73,067,012 bushels for the previous week and 153,508,840 bushels for the week ending October 30, 1936. The stocks of 74,483,913 bushels include 16,991,376 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,524,000 bushels, an increase of 618,151 bushels over the previous week when 1,905,849 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 1,613,000; Erie Canal 120,000; New York 768,000 and Baltimore 23,000 bushels. Increases are shown at Buffalo of 712,151; and New York 97,000 bushels while decreases were noted at Erie Canal of 191,000 bushels. The stocks at Baltimore were unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 22,282,462 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 5,582,050; Buffalo 9,748,000; Erie 1,726,000; New York 2,097,412; Albany 3,048,000; Philadelphia 1,000; and Chicago 80,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 2,443,368 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending October 29, 1937 were 71,950,011 bushels compared with 71,151,261 bushels for the previous week and 131,226,378 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in the Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 19,645,000; Interior Terminals 6,057,206; Vancouver-New Westminster 2,597,148; Prince Rupert 911,340; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 19,548,742; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 9,153,294 and 4,795,694 bushels respectively.

Increases over the previous week were shown in the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 1,025,000; Interior Elevators 59,884; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 415,553 and 313,951 bushels respectively, while decreases were noted at Vancouver-New Westminster of 270,231 and Fort William-Port Arthur 1,326,815 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 5,758,414 bushels for the week ending October 29, 1937 compared with 10,010,729 bushels for the same period last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 2,838,063 bushels against 4,291,688 bushels last year.

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OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending October 29, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,712,257 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 96,000 bushels. The total is 2,808,257 bushels as compared with 2,661,612 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 146,645 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 3,126,732 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending October 30, 1937 amounted to 11,888,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,132,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,128,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from Argentina showed a decrease of 823,000 bushels, while shipments from North America and Australia showed increases of 1,065,000 and 594,000 bushels respectively, as compared with the previous week. Russian shipments amounted to 3,632,000 bushels, the largest shipment from that country since 1931-32.

During the first thirteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 113.2 million bushels as compared with 141.6 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 42.3 million bushels this year, as compared with 73.2 million bushels in 1936. Australian shipments are 15.4 million bushels this year as compared with 18.0 for the same period last year. Russian shipments amounted to 17.2 million bushels while last year for the same period they were only 88,000 bushels.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 8.7 million bushels per week compared with 10.9 million bushels for the same period last year. North American weekly average shipments amounted to only 3.2 million bushels per week as compared with 5.6 million bushels per week for the same period last year. Russian shipments averaged 1.3 million bushels per week this year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 29, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Oct. 29, 1937 show an increase of 3,394,143 bushels, compared with the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 74,483,913, oats 9,178,852, barley 12,726,214, flaxseed 678,206 and rye 1,288,151 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 1,416,901, oats 1,723,129, barley 181,861, flaxseed 61,890 and rye 10,362 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 153,508,840, oats 17,651,290, barley 17,374,096, flaxseed 1,038,130 and rye 2,831,682 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net increase of 2,737,000 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 1,025,000, oats 1,220,000, barley 468,000 and flaxseed 36,000 bushels, while rye decreased 12,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show an increase of 28,118 bushels composed of wheat 11,884, oats 16,175 and barley 59 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 255,896 bushels. Wheat stocks show a decrease of 270,231 bushels, while increases were shown in oats of 1,820, barley 11,855 and rye 660 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,957,454 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,326,815, oats 67,832 and barley 614,351 bushels, while flaxseed and rye increased 4,889 and 46,655 bushels respectively.
