WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 12, 1937 decreased 1,406,423 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 70,222,003 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 72,867,969 bushels compared with 74,274,392 bushels for the previous week and 142,489,972 bushels for the week ending November 13, 1936. The stocks of 72,867,969 bushels include 16,904,839 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,449,902 bushels, a decrease of 38,000 bushels from the previous week when 2,487,902 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 1,583,000; Erie Canal 273,000; New York 584,000 and Duluth 9,902 bushels. Increases are shown at Erie Canal of 2,000 and New York 2,000 bushels while a decrease is noted at Buffalo of 42,000. Stocks at Duluth were unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 23,878,349 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 5,562,520; Buffalo 9,961,000; Erie 2,462,000; New York 2,711,829; Albany 3,048,000; and Chicago 133,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 2,286,824 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending November 12, 1937 were 70,418,067 bushels compared with 71,786,490 bushels for the previous week and 118,611,623 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 19,228,000; Interior Terminals 6,134,606; Vancouver-New Westminster 2,444,976; Prince Rupert 911,340; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 18,588,501; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 9,029,414 and 4,587,564 bushels respectively.

Decreases from the previous week were shown in the following elevators: Western Country Elevator 672,000; Head of the Lakes, Fort William and Port Arthur 1,079,306; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 372,919 and 349,469 bushels, while increases were noted at Interior Private and Mill Elevators of 48,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 123 and Vancouver-New Westminster of 19,602 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 5,685,473 bushels for the week ending November 12, 1937 compared with 8,399,502 bushels for the same period last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 3,127,140 bushels against 3,530,766 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 12, 1937 amounted to 2,694,077 bushels, a decrease of 1,637,498 bushels from the previous week when 4,331,575 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 2,013,540 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending November 12, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 346,760 (153,970); Saskatchewan 491,088 (792,552); Alberta 1,856,229 (1,067,018) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the fifteen weeks from August 1, 1937 to November 12, 1937 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 31,052,893 (17,523,628); Saskatchewan 18,713,181 (72,657,679); Alberta 38,741,447 (35,349,512) bushels. For the fifteen weeks ending November 12, 1937 and November 13, 1936, 88,507,521 and 125,530,819 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending November 12, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,084,965 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 63,000 bushels. The total is 3,147,965 bushels as compared with 2,171,029 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 1,976,936 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 2,425,834 bushels.

The accumulated totals of imports of wheat into the United States for consumption and milling in bond are adjusted at the end of the month, due to the fact that the United States Department of Domestic and Foreign Commerce revises their weekly figures on a monthly basis.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 12, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 12, 1937 show a net decrease of 2,209,524 bushels compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 72,867,969, oats 11,047,086, barley 12,051,748, flaxseed 684,553 and rye 1,328,302 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,406,423, barley 921,204 and flaxseed 5,667 bushels, while oats and rye increased 81,200 and 42,570 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year grain in store was as follows:- wheat 142,489,972, oats 17,133,391, barley 16,742,190, flaxseed 1,074,996 and rye 2,488,638 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 911,000 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 672,000, barley 340,000, flaxseed 4,000 and rye 5,000 bushels, while oats increased 110,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC & SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 2,395 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 123 and oats 4,173 bushels, while barley decreased 1,901 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 49,370 bushels. Increases were as follows:- wheat 19,602, oats 11,897, barley 16,581 and rye 1,290 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,783,863 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,079,306, barley 733,630 and flaxseed 24,803 bushels, while oats and rye increased 6,909 and 46,967 bushels respectively.
