WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 19, 1937 decreased 3,245,756 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 65,638,910 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 69,818,376 bushels compared with 73,064,132 bushels for the previous week and 135,457,286 bushels for the week ending November 20, 1936. The stocks of 69,818,376 bushels include 15,766,666 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 3,331,000 bushels, an increase of 881,098 bushels from the previous week when 2,449,902 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 1,966,000; Erie Canal 273,000; New York 774,000 and Albany 318,000 bushels. Increases are shown at Buffalo of 383,000; New York 190,000 and Albany 318,000 bushels, while Duluth decreased 9,902 bushels. Stocks at Erie remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,127,624 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 5,287,795; Buffalo 10,282,000; Erie 2,462,000; New York 2,925,859; Albany 3,048,000 and Chicago 122,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 2,014,722 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending November 19, 1937 were 66,487,376 bushels compared with 70,418,067 bushels for the previous week and 111,798,901 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 17,294,000; Interior Terminals 6,080,612; Vancouver-New Westminster 2,584,993; Prince Rupert 911,340; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 16,118,098; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 10,892,085 and 4,432,967 bushels respectively.

Decreases from the previous week were shown in the following elevators: Western Country elevators 1,934,000; Interior Private and Mill elevators 66,000; Fort William and Port Arthur 2,470,403 and Eastern Elevators, seaboard ports 154,597 bushels. Increases were noted at the Interior Public and Semi-Public Elevators of 12,006; Vancouver-New Westminster elevators 140,017 and Eastern Elevators, Lake ports 666,508 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 5,044,437 bushels for the week ending November 19, 1937 compared with 6,927,641 bushels for the same period last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 2,728,747 bushels against 3,800,447 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 19, 1937 amounted to 1,981,693 bushels, a decrease of 712,384 bushels from the previous week when 2,694,077 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 2,481,964 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending November 19, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 275,494 (186,249); Saskatchewan 412,491 (1,040,877); Alberta 1,293,708 (1,254,838) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the sixteen weeks from August 1, 1937 to November 19, 1937 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 31,328,387 (17,709,877); Saskatchewan 19,125,672 (73,698,556); Alberta 40,035,155 (36,604,350) bushels. For the sixteen weeks ending November 19, 1937 and November 20, 1936, 90,489,214 and 128,012,783 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending November 19, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,426,239 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 30,000 bushels. The total is 2,456,239 bushels as compared with 3,147,965 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 691,726 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 4,038,434 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending November 20, 1937 amounted to 10,794,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 11,771,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,992,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from Argentina amounted to 1,012,000 bushels while last week they were nil. Shipments from North America showed an increase of 302,000 bushels, as compared with the previous week, while Australian shipments were 963,000 bushels lower. Russian shipments amounted to 1,832,000 bushels.

During the first sixteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 147.4 million bushels as compared with 176.2 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 57.4 million bushels this year as compared with 91.1 million bushels in 1936. Argentine shipments are only 11.7 million bushels this year as compared with 17.3 for the same period last year. Russian shipments amounted to 24.7 million bushels while last year for the same period they were only 88,000 bushels.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first sixteen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1936:-

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 9.2 million bushels per week compared with 11.0 million bushels for the same period last year. North American weekly average shipments amounted to only 3.6 million bushels per week as compared with 5.7 million bushels per week for the same period last year. Russian shipments averages 1.5 million bushels per week this year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 19, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Nov. 19, 1937 show a net decrease of 3,480,654 bushels, compared with the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 69,818,376, oats 10,857,161, barley 12,179,691, flaxseed 587,891 and rye 1,325,827 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 3,245,756, oats 189,925, flaxseed 96,662 and rye 2,475 bushels, while barley increased 54,164 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 135,457,286, oats 16,856,303, barley 16,235,342, flaxseed 1,097,616 and rye 2,229,340 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 2,209,000 bushels composed of wheat, 1,934,000, oats 135,000, barley 115,000, flaxseed 12,000 and rye 13,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show an increase of 181,660 bushels composed of wheat 12,006, oats 10,607 and barley 159,047 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 179,007 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 140,017, oats 11,016, and barley 28,600 bushels, while rye decreased 626 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 2,510,418 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,470,403, barley 163,441 and flaxseed 13,440 bushels, while oats and rye increased 111,173 and 25,693 bushels respectively.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - LAKE PORTS:- Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 1,118,478 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat 666,508 and barley 542,905 bushels, while decreases were shown in oats of 64,242, flaxseed 24,675 and rye 2,018 bushels.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - SEABOARD PORTS:- Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 28,804 bushels. Barley increased 284,718 bushels, while decreases were shown in wheat of 154,597, oats 33,048, flaxseed 59,697 and rye 8,572 bushels.
