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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 26, 1937 decreased 2,720,798 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 61,562,252 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 67,097,578 bushels compared with 69,818,376 bushels for the previous week and 128,659,830 bushels for the week ending November 27, 1936. The stocks of 67,097,578 bushels include 15,244,783 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 4,460,000 bushels, an increase of 1,129,000 bushels from the previous week when 3,331,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 2,096,000; New York 2,001,000 and Albany 363,000 bushels. Increases are shown at Buffalo of 130,000; New York 1,227,000 and Albany 45,000 bushels, while Erie Canal stocks decreased 273,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 23,952,666 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 5,064,991; Buffalo 10,652,000; Erie 2,462,000; New York 2,478,675; Albany 3,048,000 and Chicago 247,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 1,816,267 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending November 26, 1937 were 62,637,578 bushels compared with 66,487,796 bushels for the previous week and 104,707,164 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 15,768,000; Interior Terminals 5,869,639; Vancouver-New Westminster 2,156,561; Prince Rupert 911,340; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 14,577,618; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 11,152,348 and 4,104,297 bushels respectively.

Decreases from the previous week were shown in the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 1,526,000; Interior Private and Mill elevators 210,893; Fort William and Port Arthur 1,540,480; Vancouver and New Westminster 428,432 and Eastern Elevators, Seaboard ports 328,670 bushels. An increase was noted at Eastern Elevators, Lake ports of 260,263 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 5,785,754 bushels for the week ending November 26, 1937 compared with 5,270,258 bushels for the same period last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 2,027,369 bushels against 4,719,265 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 26, 1937 amounted to 1,537,677 bushels, a decrease of 444,016 bushels from the previous week when 1,981,693 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,486,222 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending November 27, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 202,467 (80,303); Saskatchewan 290,055 (689,497); Alberta 1,045,155 (716,422) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the seventeen weeks from August 1, 1937 to November 26, 1937 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 31,530,854 (17,790,180); Saskatchewan 19,415,727 (74,388,053); Alberta 41,080,310 (37,320,772) bushels. For the seventeen weeks ending November 26, 1937 and November 27, 1936, 92,026,891 and 129,499,005 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending November 26, 1937 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,874,436 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 50,000 bushels. The total is 2,924,436 bushels as compared with 2,456,239 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 468,197 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 2,496,084 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending November 27, 1937 amounted to 9,128,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,794,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,328,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from Argentina decreased sharply from 1,012,000 bushels last week to 128,000 bushels. Shipments from North America showed a slight decrease as compared with the previous week, while Australian shipments were 49,000 bushels higher. Russian shipments amounted to 1,680,000 bushels.

During the first seventeen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 156.9 million bushels as compared with 187.6 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 63.1 million bushels this year as compared with 97.7 million bushels in 1936. Argentine shipments are only 11.9 million bushels this year as compared with 18.3 for the same period last year. Russian shipments amounted to 26.4 million bushels while last year for the same period they were only 88,000 bushels.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first seventeen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1936:-

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 9.2 million bushels per week compared with 11.0 million bushels for the same period last year. North American weekly average shipments amounted to only 3.7 million bushels per week as compared with 5.7 million bushels per week for the same period in 1936. Russian shipments averaged 1.6 million bushels per week this year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 26, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Nov. 26, 1937 show a decrease of 3,598,108 bushels compared with the previous week. Stocks of grain were as follows:- wheat 67,097,578, oats 10,443,287, barley 11,726,265, flaxseed 587,586 and rye 1,316,122 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,720,798, oats 413,874, barley 453,426, flaxseed 305 and rye 9,705 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows: wheat 128,659,830, oats 16,022,806, barley 15,224,466, flaxseed 1,003,488 and rye 2,265,075 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks this week show a decrease of 2,424,000 bushels composed of wheat 1,526,000, oats 600,000, barley 275,000, flaxseed 8,000 and rye 15,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 111,382 bushels. Increases were noted in oats of 2,130, barley 126,551 and flaxseed 1,674 bushels, while wheat decreased 18,973 bushels.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 341,273 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 428,432 and rye 390 bushels while oats and barley increased 69,558 and 17,991 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,318,882 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,540,480 and barley 75,852 bushels, while increases were shown in oats of 278,230, flaxseed 7,766 and rye 11,454 bushels.
