WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 10, 1937 decreased 1,110,269 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 55,001,811 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 61,463,193 bushels compared with 62,573,462 bushels for the previous week and 116,465,004 bushels for the week ending December 11, 1936. The stocks of 61,463,193 bushels include 14,601,451 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,066,000 bushels, a net decrease of 110,000 bushels from the previous week when 5,176,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 922,000; New York 2,637,000; Erie 464,000; Albany 388,000 and Baltimore 3,000 bushels. Decreases are shown at Buffalo of 769,000; Albany 57,000 and Baltimore 17,000 bushels, while increases were noted at Erie of 238,000 and New York 495,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,417,045 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 4,565,285; Buffalo 9,758,000; Erie 1,015,591; New York 5,808,169; Albany 3,048,000 and Chicago 222,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 1,945,439 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending December 10, 1937 were 56,397,193 bushels compared with 57,397,462 bushels for the previous week and 92,047,959 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 15,055,000; Interior Terminals 5,877,643; Vancouver-New Westminster 2,469,879; Prince Rupert 911,340; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 10,459,995; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 13,842,593 and 3,626,271 bushels respectively.

Decreases from the previous week were shown in the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 85,000; and Fort William and Port Arthur of 1,206,153 bushels. Increases were noted at Interior Terminals 38,010; Vancouver-New Westminster 99,066; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 1,591,348 and 196,830 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 3,135,607 bushels for the week ending December 10, 1937 compared with 346,218 bushels for the same period last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 978,907 bushels against 3,874,600 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 10, 1937 amounted to 1,160,640 bushels, a decrease of 494,610 bushels over the previous week when 1,655,250 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,304,451 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending December 10, 1937 were as fellows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 145,128 (85,444); Saskatchewan 203,120 (386,969); Alberta 812,392 (832,038) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the nineteen weeks from August 1, 1937 to December 10, 1937 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 31,964,385 (18,043,345); Saskatchewan 19,852,924 (75,466,304); Alberta 43,025,472 (39,206,043) bushels. For the nineteen weeks ending December 10, 1937 and December 11, 1936, 94,842,781 and 132,715,692 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending December 10, 1937 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,230,029 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 3,000 bushels. The total is 1,233,029 bushels as compared with 2,543,945 bushels for the provious week, a decrease of 1,310,916 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 2,937,752 bushels.

MOVEMENTS OF UNITED STATES WHEAT THROUGH EASTERN CANADA, 1937

According to Eastern Elevators returns there were three cargoes of United States wheat amounting to 409,394 bushels received at the Georgian Bay Ports, of which only 80,000 bushels were shipped to local points and 6,100 bushels to the Flour Mills, while 387,894 bushels were left in the Eastern Elevators.

Quantity received at the Lower Lake Ports was 2,278,979 bushels. Shipments show 1,124,039 bushels moved to Montreal by vessel and some 5,182 bushels were re-shipped across the border to United States points. The Canadian Flour Mills consumed 510,179 bushels, while 26,221 bushels went to local points. The amount remaining in the elevators was 613,577 bushels.

Receipts at the St. Lawrence ports were 3,726,621 bushels, which includes the

Receipts at the St. Lawrence ports were 3,726,621 bushels, which includes the amount of 1,124,039 bushels shipped from Lower Lake Ports to Montreal. The shipments amounting to 3,306,408 bushels went to overseas countries, while 24,088 bushels went to local points. The balance of 396,122 bushels still remains in the Montreal and Three Rivers Elevators.

From the foregoing it will be seen that 516,279 bushels were shipped to Canadian Flour Mills, 130,309 bushels moved to local points, and 5,182 bushels were re-shipped to United States points. The largest quantity, 3,306,408 bushels, was re-exported to overseas countries from the St. Lawrence Ports.



CAMADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECLARER 10, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 10, 1937 show a decrease of 2,122,441 bushels compared with the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 61,463,193, oats 9,729,847, barley 10,996,546, flaxseed 512,225 and rye 1,308,864 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,110,269, oats 628,530, barley 336,518 and flaxseed 23,657, and rye 23,467 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 116,465,004, oats 15,400,673, barley 15,989,753, flaxseed 890,584 and rye 2,016,135 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Grain in store shows a decrease of 1,030,000 bushels composed of wheat 85,000, oats 605,000, barley 335 and rye 5,000 bushels.



INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. - Stocks for the week show an increase of 19,888 bushels composed of wheat 4,010, oats 15,430 and barley 448 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 363,614 bushels. Increases were as follows: wheat 99,066, oats 150,588, barley 111,600, flaxseed 26 and rye 2,330 bushels.
