WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 24, 1937 decreased 1,710,574 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 56,700,509 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 58,838,944 bushels compared with 60,349,518 bushels for the previous week and 115,539,453 bushels for the week ending December 25, 1936. The stocks of 58,838,944 bushels include 14,328,913 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN THEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 4,834,000 bushels, a net decrease of 481,000 bushels from the previous week when 5,315,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 379,000; New York 3,100,000; Erie 1,077,-900; Albany 276,000 and Philadelphia 2,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in all the ports except Albany which remained the same as the previous week, viz., 276,000 bushels. The decreases were as follows: Buffalo 220,000; Erie 39,000; New York 31,000 and Philadelphia 191,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 28,187,544 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 3,647,946; Buffalo 8,740,000; Erie 2,123,201; New York 9,735,749; Albany 3,048,000; Chicago 262,000; Toledo 110,648; Cleveland 310,000 and Detroit 210,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 1,861,765 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending December 24, 1937 were 54,004,944 bushels compared with 55,034,518 bushels for the previous week and 87,351,909 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 15,693,000; Interior Terminals 5,836,278; Vancouver-New Westminster 2,181,855; Prince Rupert 911,340; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 10,524,526; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 11,467,543 and 3,265,800 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Private and Mill Elevators 37,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public Elevators 34,823; Vancouver-New Westminster 268,112; Fort William and Port Arthur 83,082; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,344,462 bushels while increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 403,000 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 65,734 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 4,112,782 bushels for the week ending December 17, 1937 compared with 4,263,763 bushels for the same period last year. There was no wheat In Transit on the Lakes, owing to navigation being closed.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 24, 1937 amounted to 1,494,284 bushels, an increase of 165,066 bushels over the previous week when 1,329,218 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 2,111,700 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending December 25, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936, Manitoba 146,911 (78,614); Saskatchewan 363,122 (939,002); Alberta 984,251 (1,093,084) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-one weeks from August 1, 1937 to December 25, 1937 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 32,278,654 (18,192,884); Saskatchewan 20,439,271 (77,230,192); Alberta 44,948,358 (41,503,218) bushels. For the twenty-one weeks ending December 24, 1937 and December 25, 1936 97,666,283 and 136,927,294 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSIAS EXFORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF THEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending December 24, 1937 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,032,583 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 23,000 bushels. The total is 2,055,583 bushels as compared with 1,890,808 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 164,775 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 748,963 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending December 25, 1937 amounted to 10,189,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,121,000 hushels for the previous week and 11,232,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from North America, Argentina and Australia showed increases of 618,000, 844,000 and 150,000 bushels respectively, as compared with the previous week. Russian shipments dropped to 320,000 bushels this week.

During the first twenty-one weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 197.8 million bushels as compared with 229.2 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 82.1 million bushels this year as compared with 117.3 million bushels in 1936. Argentine shipments are only 15.6 million bushels this year as compared with 25.7 for the same period last year. Russian shipments amounted to 30 million bushels while last year for the same period they were only 88,000 bushels.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 9.4 million bushels per week compared with 10.9 million bushels for the same period last year. North American weekly average shipments amounted to only 3.9 million bushels per week as compared with 5.6 million bushels per week for the same period in 1936. Russian shipments averaged 1.4 million bushels per week this year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 24, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 24, 1937 show a decrease of 1,834,211 bushels compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 58,838,944, oats 9,541,626, barley 10,662,198, flaxseed 491,622 and rye 1,304,909 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,510,574, oats 122,531, barley 191,377, flaxseed 5,686 and rye 4,043 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 115, 539,453, oats 15,182,305, barley 14,891,483, flaxseed 866,214 and rye 2,179,817 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Grain in store shows a net increase of 358,000 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 403,000, flaxseed 3,000 and rye 2,000 bushels, while oats and barley each decreased 25,000 bushels.



INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-FUBLIC TERMINALS. Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 86,925 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 34,823 and barley 58,425 bushels, while oats increased 6,323 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 214,254 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 268,112 and flaxseed 493 bushels, while increases were shown in cats of 4,299, barley 47,666 and rye 2,386 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR AND CHURCHILL ELEVATOR .- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTMUR). - Grain stocks show a net decrease of 120,992 bushels. Decreases were shown in wheat of 83,082, oats 15,031, barley 19,210 and rye 7,689 bushels, while flaxseed increased 4,020 bushels.




STOCKS OF GRAIN IN DIFFERENT ELEVATORS DURING THE WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 24, 1937


