WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 31, 1937 decreased 1,461,277 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 55,915,557 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 57,377,667 bushels compared with 58,838,944 bushels for the previous week and 113,293,224 bushels for the week ending January 1, 1937. The stocks of 57,377,667 bushels include 14,297,244 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 4,704,000 bushels, a net decrease of 130,000 bushels from the previous week when 4,834,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 330,000; New York 3,017,000; Erie 1,077,000; Albany 276,000 and Philadelphia 4,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in all the ports except Albany and Erie which remained the same as the previous week's total, viz., 276,000 and 1,077,000 bushels respectively. The decreases were as follows: Buffalo 49,000; New York 83,000; while an increase is noted in Philadelphia of 2,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 27,775,386 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 3,581,285; Buffalo 8,619,000; Erie 2,123,201; New York 9,511,252; Albany 3,048,000; Chicago 262,000; Toledo 110,648; Cleveland 310,000 and Detroit 210,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 1,858,276 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending December 31, 1937 were 52,673,667 bushels compared with 54,004,944 bushels for the previous week and 85,517,838 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 15,507,000; Interior Terminals 5,762,598; Vancouver-New Westminster 2,381,251 Prince Rupert 598,412; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 10,633,448; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 10,743,876 and 3,587,188 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 186,000; Interior Private and Mill 53,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 20,680; Frince Rupert 312,928 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 723,667 bushels, while increases were noted at Vancouver-New Westminster 199,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 108,922 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 321,388 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 3,448,074 bushels for the week ending December 31 1937 compared with 3,924,933 bushels for the same period last year. There was no wheat In Transit on the Lakes, owing to navigation being closed.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 31, 1937 amounted to 608,963 bushels, a decrease of 885,321 bushels from the previous week when 1,494,284 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,187,316 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending December 31, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 49,471 (132,152); Saskatchewan 174,901 (482,442); Alberta 384,271 (572,722) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-two weeks from August 1, 1937 to December 31, 1937 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 32,328,125 (18,326,036); Saskatchewan 20,614,172 (77,712,634); Alberta 45,332,629 (42,075,940) bushels. For the twenty-two weeks ending December 31, 1937 and 1936, 98,275,246 and 138,114,610 bushels respectively were received from the farms. The quantities loaded over platforms were not reported

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND INFORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending December 31, 1937 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,317,567 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 16,000 bushels. The total is 1,333,567 bushels as compared with 2,055,583 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 722,016 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 2,065,980 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending January 1, 1938 amounted to 8,405,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,189,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,360,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from North America and Argentina showed decreases of 1,748,000 and 796,000 bushels respectively, as compared with the previous week, while Australian shipments showed an increase of 968,000 bushels.

During the first twenty-two weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 206.1 million bushels as compared with 240.5 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 85.1 million bushels this year as compared with 121.2 million bushels in 1936-37. Argentine shipments are only 16.7 million bushels this year as compared with 29.8 for the same period last year. Russian shipments amounted to 30 million bushels while last year for the same period they were only 88,000 bushels.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty-two weeks of the present crop year along with the comparative figures for 1936-37:-

North American weekly average shipments amounted to only 3.9 million bushels per week as compared with 5.5 million bushels for the same period in 1936-37. Russian shipments averaged 1.4 million bushels per week this year.

CAMADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Dec. 31, 1937 show a decrease of 2,136,125 bushels compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 57,377,667, oats 9,348,123, barley 10,226,473, flaxseed 473,441 and rye 1,277,470 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,461,277, oats 193,503, barley 435,725, flaxseed 18,181 and rye 27,439 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks were as follows:- wheat 113,293,224, oats 15,154,852, barley 14,855,359, flaxseed 837,381 and rye 2,167,394 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY EIE VATORS: - Grain in store shows a decrease of 397,000 bushels made up as follows: - wheat 186,000, oats 130,000, barley 80,000 and flaxseed 1,000 bushels.


INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 20,320 bushels. Wheat and barley decreased 20,680 and 1,599 bushels respectively, while cats increased 1,959 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 364,894 bushels made up as follows: - wheat 199,396, oats 46,949, barley 117,389 and rye 1,160 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR .- Wheat stocks decreased 312,928 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR .- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Grain stocks show a net increase of 63,937 bushels. Wheat and flaxseed increased 108,922 and 3,310 bushels respectively while decreases were noted in oats of 22,947, barley 5,525 and rye 19,823 bushels.
