WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 4, 1938 decreased 1,132,365 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 45,384,184 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 52,210,581 bushels compared with 53,432,946 bushels for the previous week and 97,594,765 bushels for the week ending February 5, 1937. The stocks of 52,210,581 bushels include 14,898,043 bushels of Durum wheat.

CAMADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,883,000 bushels, a net decrease of 462,000 bushels from the previous week when 3,345,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 155,000; New York 1,721,000; Erie 731,000 and Albany 276,000 bushels. Decreases are noted at Buffalo of 115,000 and New York 347,000 bushels. Stocks at Albany and Erie remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 22,370,556 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,837,505; Buffalo 6,013,000; Erie 2,123,201; New York 7,564,402; Albany 3,048,000; Chicago 239,000; Toledo 110,648; Cleveland 310,000; Philadelphia 5,000 and Detroit 120,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 1,431,134 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending February 4, 1938 were 49,327,581 bushels compared with 50,087,946 bushels for the previous week and 75,426,395 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 15,193,000; Interior Terminals 5,815,848; Vancouver-New Westminster 2,903,604; Prince Rupert 292,279; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Fort Arthur 11,350,573; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 8,387,029 and 3,183,910 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 182,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public Elevators 1,104; Vancouver-New Westminster 178,815; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 401,697 and 343,891 bushels respectively. Increases were noted at the Interior Private and Mill Elevators of 17,000 and Fort William and Port Arthur 317,749 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,189,518 bushels for the week ending February 4, 1938 compared with 2,403,216 bushels for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Frovinces for the week ending February 4, 1938 amounted to 572,589 bushels, a decrease of 352,129 bushels from the previous week when 924,718 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 448,124 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending February 4, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 92,500 (36,235); Saskatchewan 131,655 (168,345); Alberta 348,434 (243,544) bushels. Marketings in the three Frairic Provinces for the twenty-seven weeks from August 1, 1937 to February 4, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 33,097,054 (18,550,231); Saskatchewan 22,120,554 (78,958,269); Alberta 49,216,609 (44,134,917) bushels. Fo the twenty-seven weeks, ending February 4, 1938 and February 5, 1937, 104,434,217 and 141,643,417 bushels. respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending February 4, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,121,713 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 2,000 bushels. The total is 1,123,713 bushels as compared with 1,108,571 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 15,142 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 1,569,972 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending February 5, 1938 amounted to 10,868,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,690,000 bushels for the previous week and 14,928,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from Australia showed a decrease of 989,000 bushels as compared with the previous week, while Argentine shipments showed an increase of 824,000 bushels.

During the first twenty-seven weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 256 million bushels as compared with 311.8 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 103.6 million bushels this year as compared with 137.4 million bushels in 1936-37. Argentine shipments are only 27.1 million bushels this year as compared with 62.6 for the same period last year. Russian shipments amounted to 33.6 million bushels while last year for the same period they were only 88,000 bushels.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty-seven weeks of the present crop year along with the comparative figures for 1936-37:-

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 9.4 million bushels per week compared with 11.5 million bushels for the same period last year. North American weekly average shipments amounted to only 3.8 million bushels per week as compared with 5.1 million bushels for the same period in 1936-37. Russian shipments averaged 1.2 million bushels per week this year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 4, 1938

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 4, 1938 show a net decrease of 1,421,600 bushels compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows:— wheat 52,210,581, oats 9,405,197, barley 9,629,733, flaxseed 484,717 and rye 1,295,361 bushels. Decreases were shown in wheat of 1,222,365, barley 250,545 and flaxseed 2,032 bushels while oats and rye increased 45,531 and 7,811 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows:— wheat 97,594,765, oats 12,956,589, barley 14,090,324, flaxseed 718,336 and rye 2,017,148 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: Grain in store shows a net decrease of 184,000 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 182,000, barley 10,000 and flaxseed 1,000 bushels, while oats and rye increased 5,000 and 4,000 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. - Stocks for the week show a net increase of 28,021 bushels. Increases were noted in oats of 28,914 and barley 211 bushels while wheat decreased 1,104 bushels.

VALCOUVER-NEW WESTHINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 319,860 bushels composed of wheat 178,815, oats 2,836 and barley 138,209 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS .- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR)- Grain stocks show a net increase of 299,963 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 317,749, cats 27,292 and rye 2,967 bushels while oats and flaxseed decreased 47,013 and 1,032 bushels respectively.

STOCKS OF GRAIN IN DIFFERENT ELEVATORS DURING THE NEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 4, 1938


