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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 11, 1938 decreased 1,528,035 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 44,227,270 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 50,682,546 bushels compared with 52,210,581 bushels for the previous week and 94,909,816 bushels for the week ending February 12, 1937. The stocks of 50,682,546 bushels include 14,900,056 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,641,000 bushels, a net decrease of 242,000 bushels from the previous week when 2,883,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 140,000; New York 1,494,000; Erie 731,000 and Albany 276,000 bushels. Decreases are noted at Buffalo of 15,000 and New York 227,000 bushels. Stocks at Albany and Erie remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 22,466,457 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,705,908; Buffalo 5,853,000; Erie 2,123,201; New York 7,346,000; Albany 2,770,700; Chicago 232,000; Toledo 110,648; Cleveland 200,000; Philadelphia 5,000 and Detroit 120,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 1,408,274 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending February 11, 1938 were 48,041,646 bushels compared with 49,327,581 bushels for the previous week and 73,349,613 bushels for the corresponding week last year.


Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 15,005,000; Interior Terminals 5,706,751; Vancouver-New Westminster 2,563,142; Prince Rupert 292,279; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 11,506,745; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 7,857,670 and 3,150,849 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 188,000; Interior Elevators 109,097; Vancouver-New Westminster 340,462; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 529,359 and 33,061 bushels while an increase is noted at the Head of the Lakes of 156,172 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,947,290 bushels for the week ending February 11, 1938 compared with 2,210,764 bushels for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 11, 1938 amounted to 626,280 bushels, a increase of 55,691 bushels from the previous week when 572,589 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 470,904 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending February 11, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 152,525 (27,469); Saskatchewan 92,649 (163,326); Alberta 383,106 (280,109) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-eight weeks from August 1, 1937 to February 11, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 33,249,579 (18,577,700); Saskatchewan 22,213,203 (78,121,595); Alberta 49,599,715 (44,415,026) bushels. For the twenty-eight weeks ending February 11, 1938 and February 12, 1937, 105,062,497 and 142,114,321 bushels respectively were received from the farms.



OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending February 11, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,733,048 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were nil. The total is 1,733,048 bushels as compared with 1,123,713 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 609,335 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 366,950 bushels.



The accumulated totals of imports of wheat into United States for consumption and milling in bond are adjusted at the end of the month, due to the fact that the United States Department of Domestic and Foreign Commerce revises their weekly figures on a monthly basis.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 11, 1938

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 11, 1938 show a decrease of 1,949,144 bushels, compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 50,682,546, oats 9,235,937, barley 9,387,178, flaxseed 481,873 and rye 1,288,911 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,528,035, oats 169,260, barley 242,555, flaxseed 2,844 and rye 6,450 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 94,909,816, oats 12,625,468, barley 13,976,158, flaxseed 693,173 and rye 1,995,539 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Grain in store shows a net increase of 25,000 bushels. Increases were noted in oats of 150,000, barley 60,000 and rye 3,000 bushels, while wheat decreased 188,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. - Stocks for the week show a net increase of 36,753 bushels. Increases were noted in oats of 35,632 and barley 6,218 bushels, while wheat decreased 5,097 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 558,634 bushels, composed of wheat 340,462, oats 120,848 and barley 97,324 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS. - Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Grain stocks show a net increase of 119,877 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 156,172, barley 27,017, flaxseed 1,156 and rye 281 bushels while oats decreased 64,749 bushels.





STOCKS OF GRAIN IN DIFFERENT ELEVATORS DURING THE WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 11, 1938


