WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 20, 1937, increased 1,541,327 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 92,892,335 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 30,769,031 bushels compared with 29,227,704 bushels for the previous week and 123,661,366 bushels for the week ending August 21, 1936.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,601,000 bushels, a decrease of 717,720 bushels from the previous week when 3,318,720 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 236,000; New York 1,693,000 and Albany 672,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in the stocks at the following ports: Duluth 136,020; Albany 132,700; New York 31,000 and Buffalo 418,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,544,757 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 5,436,218; Buffalo 7,448,000; Erie 1,713,000; New York 1,912,539; Albany 2,874,000 and Chicago 131,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending August 20, 1937, amounted to 28,032,011 bushels compared with 25,908,984 bushels for the previous week and 104,116,609 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country elevators 6,400,000; Interior Terminals 3,178,792; Vancouver-New Westminster 3,242,428; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 10,587; Head of the Lakes 4,461,286; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 3,620,722 and 3,145,690 bushels respectively.

Increases over the previous week are shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 2,270,000; Interior Public & Semi-Public elevators 5,373; while decreases were noted at Interior Private & Mill Elevators of 493,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 26,525; Churchill 297,965; Eastern Elevators, Lake ports 145,007 and Seaboard Ports 185,854 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,440,988 bushels for the week ending August 20, 1937, compared with 10,677,416 bushels for the same period last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 576,321 bushels against 3,391,086 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 6, 1937, amounted to 202,653 bushels, a decrease of 410,018 bushels from the previous week when 612,671 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,713,506 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending August 6, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 27,621 (193,920); Saskatchewan 93,649 (993,963); Alberta 81,383 (525,623) bushels.





OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending August 20, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,980,739 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 188,000 bushels. The total is 2,168,739 bushels as compared with 1,492,798 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 675,941 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 2,505,920 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending August 21, 1937 amounted to 7,533,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 6,452,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,336,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from North America showed an increase over the previous week of 1,412,000 bushels while shipments from the Argentine and Australia showed decreases of 23,000 and 556,000 bushels respectively.

During the first three weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 21 million bushels as compared with 30.1 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 8.9 million bushels this year as compared with 18.4 million bushels in 1936.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 7 million bushels compared with 10 million bushels per week for the same period last year. North American weekly average shipments amounted to only 3 million bushels per week as compared with 6.1 million bushels per week for the same period last year.





CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 20, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Aug. 20, 1937 show a net increase of 3,280,197 bushels compared with the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 30,769,031, oats 2,448,347, barley 4,454,090, flaxseed 377,810 and rye 750,953 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 1,541,327, oats 21,454, barley 1,446,077 and rye 321,666 bushels while flaxseed decreased 50,327 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 123,661,366, oats 9,483,578, barley 8,359,023, flaxseed 319,184 and rye 3,482,269 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net increase of 2,975,000 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 2,270,000, oats 137,000, barley 492,000 and rye 88,000 bushels while flaxseed decreased 12,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 7,412 bushels. Decreases were noted in oats of 12,485 and barley 300 bushels, while wheat increased 5,373 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS - Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 34,643 bushels composed of wheat 26,525, oats 6,938, barley 980 and rye 200 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks decreased 283,982 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 247,447 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 297,965, oats 82,823 and flaxseed 1,326 bushels while barley and rye increased 49,125 and 85,542 bushels respectively.
