WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 10, 1938 decreased 350,714 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 39,308,410 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 47,010,971 bushels compared with 47,361,685 bushels for the previous week and 86,319,381 bushels for the week ending March 12, 1937. The stocks of 47,010,971 bushels include 14,631,122 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,888,900 bushels, a net decrease of 57,100 bushels from the previous week when 1,946,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 26,000; New York 809,000; Erie 695,000; Albany 212,900; and Boston 146,000 bushels. Decreases are noted at Buffalo of 1,000 and New York 83,000; Erie 36,000 and Albany 63,100 bushels while stocks at Boston increased 126,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,117,763 bushels distributed as follows:- Duluth 2,057,244; Buffalo 4,033,000; Erie 2,123,201; New York 5,709,000; Albany 2,532,670; Chicago 232,000; Toledo 110,647; Cleveland 200,000 and Detroit 120,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 1,191,307 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending March 11, 1938 were 45,122,071 bushels compared with 45,415,685 bushels for the previous week and 69,201,618 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 15,355,000; Interior Terminals 5,267,144; Vancouver-New Westminster 1,698,528; Prince Rupert 292,279; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 12,220,459; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 6,347,260 and 2,398,156 bushels respectively.

Increases in stocks over those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 198,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public Elevators 948 and Fort William and Port Arthur 286,677 bushels, while decreases were shown at Interior Private and Mill Elevators of 162,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 178,539 and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 383,828 and 157,552 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,551,425 bushels for the week ending March 11, 1938 compared with 1,701,269 bushels for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 11, 1938 amounted to 1,203,523 bushels, a decrease of 195,256 bushels from the previous week when 1,398,779 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,394,396 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending March 11, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 355,484; (120,523); Saskatchewan 309,026 (771,875); Alberta 539,013 (501,998) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-two weeks from August 1, 1937 to March 11, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 34,173,864 (18,906,121); Saskatchewan 23,100,878 (81,297,985); Alberta 51,582,238 (46,425,411) bushels. For the thirty-two weeks ending March 11, 1938 and March 12, 1937 108,856,980 and 146,629,517 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending March 11, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 801,457 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 1,000 bushels. The total is 802,457 bushels as compared with 1,415,396 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 26,894 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 612,939 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 11, 1938.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 11, 1938 show a net decrease of 423,839 bushels compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows:- Wheat 47,010,971, oats 9,724,615, barley 9,054,792, flaxseed 474,299 and rye 1,277,856 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 350,714, barley 155,960 and flaxseed 233 bushels while oats and rye increased 81,576 and 1,492 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 86,319,381, oats 12,091,335, barley 12,528,454, flaxseed 678,659 and rye 1,952,476 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show an increase of 484,000 bushels composed of wheat 198,000, oats 185,000, barley 95,000, flaxseed 4,000 and rye 2,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:- Stocks for the week show an increase of 44,370 bushels composed of wheat 948, oats 29,556 and barley 13,866 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 330,182 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 178,539, oats 86,332 and barley 67,366 bushels while rye increased 1,055 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR):- Grain stocks show a net increase of 302,934 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 286,677, barley 93,190 and rye 7,938 bushels while oats decreased 84,871 bushels.





STOCKS OF GRAIN IN DIFFERENT ELEVATORS DURING THE WEEK ENDING MARCH 11, 1938.




