WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 18, 1938 decreased 1,008,771 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 19,211,826 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 46,002,200 bushels compared with 47,010,971 bushels for the previous week and 85,214,026 bushels for the week ending March 19, 1937. The stocks of 46,002,200 bushels include 14,735,580 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,734,900 bushels, a net decrease of 154,000 bushels from the previous week when 1,888,900 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 25,000; New York 573,000; Erie 695,000; Albany 212,900 and Boston 229,000 bushels. Decreases are noted at Buffalo of 1,000 and New York 236,000 bushels, while the stocks at Boston increased 83,000 bushels. The wheat in store at Albany and Erie remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 15,874,638 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 1,982,119; Buffalo 3,461,000; Erie 2,123,201; New York 5,113,000; Albany 2,532,670; Chicago 232,000; Toledo 110,648; Cleveland 200,000 and Detroit 120,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 1,101,462 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending March 18, 1938 were 44,267,300 bushels compared with 45,122,071 bushels for the previous week and 69,339,388 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 15,195,000; Interior Terminals 5,189,187; Vancouver-New Westminster 1,498,387; Prince Rupert 292,279; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 12,593,451; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 5,905,501 and 2,250,593 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 160,000; Interior Private and Mill Elevators 78,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 200,141; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 421,759 and 147,563 bushels respectively. Increases were noted at Interior Private and Mill Elevators 43 and Head of the Lakes 372,992 bushels. Stocks at Prince Rupert and Churchill remained unchanged.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,331,082 bushels for the week ending March 18, 1938 compared with 2,377,026 bushels for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 18, 1938 amounted to 1,014,596 bushels, a decrease of 188,927 bushels from the previous week when 1,203,523 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,422,401 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending March 18, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 269,749 (126,077); Saskatchewan 300,185 (683,112); Alberta 444,662 (613,212) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-three weeks from August 1, 1937 to March 18, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 34,443,613 (19,032,198); Saskatchewan 23,401,063 (81,981,097); Alberta 52,026,900 (47,038,623) bushels. For the thirty-three weeks ending March 18, 1938 and March 19, 1937, 109,871,576 and 148,051,918 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending March 18, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 858,974 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 1,000 bushels. The total is 859,974 bushels as compared with 802,457 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 1,050 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 839,543 bushels.

Clearances by ports for the weeks ending March 18, 1938 and March 19, 1937 and imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were as follows (in bushels):-

World shipments for the week ending March 19, 1938 amounted to 11,641,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,516,000 bushels for the previous week and 14,920,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from North America showed an increase of 1,218,000 bushels as compared with the previous week, while Argentine and Australian shipments were lower by 239,000 and 670,000 bushels respectively.

During the first thirty-three weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 325 million bushels as compared with 399 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 125.1 million bushels as compared with 152.6 million bushels in 1936-37. Argentine shipments were only 42.9 million bushels this year as compared with 111 million bushels for the same period last year. Russian shipments amounted to 35.3 million bushels so far this season.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 9.8 million bushels per week compared with 12.1 million bushels for the same period last year. North American weekly average shipments amounted to only 3.8 million bushels per week as compared with 4.6 million bushels for the same period in 1936-37. Russian shipments averaged 1.1 million bushels per week this year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 18, 1938

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 18, 1938 show a net decrease of 1,062,073 bushels compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 46,002,200, oats 9,708,769, barley 9,018,532, flaxseed 460,593 and rye 1,290,366 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,008,771, oats 15,846, barley 36,260 and flaxseed 13,706 bushels, while rye increased 12,510 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 85,214,026, oats 11,779,818, barley 11,938,790, flaxseed 673,588 and rye 1,883,153 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 206,000 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 160,000, oats 10,000, barley 35,000 and rye 3,000 bushels while flaxseed increased 2,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 4,493 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 43 and barley 15,892 bushels while oats decreased 11,442 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 257,989 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 200,141, oats 42,965 and barley 17,146 bushels while rye increased 2,263 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (PORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net increase of 368,595 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 372,992, barley 76,651 and rye 14,801 bushels while oats decreased 95,849 bushels.
