WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 25, 1938 decreased 1,187,840 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 38,966,264 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 44,814,360 bushels compared with 46,002,200 bushels for the previous week and 83,780,624 bushels for the week ending March 26, 1937. The stocks of 44,814,360 bushels include 14,431,230 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,235,185 bushels, a net decrease of 499,715 bushels from the previous week when 1,734,900 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 24,000; New York 359,000; Erie 695,000 and Albany 157,185 bushels. Decreases are noted at Buffalo of 1,000; New York 214,000; Albany 55,715 and Boston 229,000 bushels. The wheat in store at Erie remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 14,728,901 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 1,979,052; Buffalo 3,387,000; Erie 2,123,201; New York 4,785,000; Albany 1,800,000; Chicago 224,000; Toledo 110,648; Cleveland 200,000 and Detroit 120,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 1,020,486 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending March 25, 1938 were 43,579,175 bushels compared with 44,267,300 bushels for the previous week and 69,051,723 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 14,928,000; Interior Terminals 5,146,187; Vancouver-New Westminster 1,541,759; Prince Rupert 292,279; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 12,865,714; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 5,667,391 and 1,993,632 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 267,000; Interior Private and Mill Elevators 43,000; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 238,110 and 256,961 bushels respectively. Increases were noted at Vancouver of 43,372 and Fort William and Port Arthur 272,263 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,132,393 bushels for the week ending March 25, 1938 compared with 3,410,104 bushels for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 25, 1938 amounted to 742,325 bushels, a decrease of 272,271 bushels from the previous week when 1,014,596 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,386,966 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending March 25, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 254,437 (104,873); Saskatchewan 149,997 (639,284); Alberta 337,891 (642,809) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-four weeks from August 1, 1937 to March 25, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 34,698,050 (19,137,071); Saskatchewan 23,551,060 (82,620,381); Alberta 52,364,791 (47,681,432) bushels. For the thirty-four weeks ending March 25, 1938 and March 26, 1937, 110,613,901 and 149,438,884 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending March 25, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 960,804 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 3,000 bushels. The total is 963,804 bushels as compared with 859,974 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 103,830 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 576,450 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending March 26, 1938 amounted to 9,167,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 11,641,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,720,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from North America and Argentina were smaller than during the previous week. Australian shipments showed a decrease of 1,428,000 bushels.

During the first thirty-four weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 334.2 million bushels as compared with 410.8 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 128.4 million bushels as compared with 154.7 million bushels in 1936-37. Argentine shipments were only 44.2 million bushels this year as compared with 117 million bushels for the same period last year. Russian shipments amounted to 35.9 million bushels so far this season.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 9.8 million bushels per week compared with 11.9 million bushels for the same period last year. Russian shipments averaged 1.1 million bushels per week this year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 25, 1938

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 25, 1938 show a net decrease of 1,291,055 bushels compared with the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 44,814,360; oats 9,760,125; barley 8,892,148; flaxseed 446,019 and rye 1,276,753 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,187,840; barley 126,384; flaxseed 14,574 and rye 13,613 bushels while oats increased 51,356 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 83,780,624; oats 11,707,379; barley 11,716,856; flaxseed 667,738 and rye 1,801,220 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 357,000 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 267,000; barley 95,000; flaxseed 1,000 and rye 4,000 bushels while oats increased 10,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show an increase of 53,771 bushels composed of oats 40,804 and barley 12,967 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 5,159 bushels. Wheat stocks increased 43,372 bushels while oats and barley decreased 10,494 and 27,719 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net increase of 394,910 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 272,263 and barley 166,320 bushels while decreases were shown in oats of 39,153; flaxseed 3,121 and rye 1,399 bushels.
