WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 8, 1938 decreased 64,228 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 36,352,740 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 44,444,282 bushels compared with 44,508,510 bushels for the previous week and 80,777,022 bushels for the week ending April 9, 1937. The stocks of 44,444,282 bushels include 14,414,267 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 963,900 bushels, a net decrease of 146,100 bushels from the previous week when 1,110,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 21,000; New York 250,000; Erie 616,000 and Albany 76,900 bushels. Decreases are noted at Buffalo of 2,000; New York 65,000; Erie 79,000 and Albany 100 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 13,529,968 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 1,399,320; Buffalo 3,164,000; Erie 1,729,000; New York 4,457,000; Albany 1,331,000; Chicago 219,000; Toledo 110,648; and Detroit 120,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 906,301 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending April 8, 1938 were 43,480,382 bushels compared with 43,328,510 bushels for the previous week and 67,247,054 bushels for the corresponding week last year.


Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 13,635,000; Interior Terminals 5,074,599; Vancouver-New Westminster 1,278,366; Prince Rupert 292,279; Churchill 11,820; Port William and Port Arthur 13,740,927; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 5,187,315 and 1,732,630 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 1,073,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 212,380; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 242,749 and 217,582 bushels, while increases are noted at Interior Terminals 54,840, and the Head of the Lakes 596,999 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,527,446 bushels for the week ending April 8, 1938 compared with 4,604,142 bushels for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 8, 1938 amounted to 1,140,163 bushels, an increase of 533,198 bushels over the previous week when 606,965 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,284,434 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending April 8, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 393,720 (97,941); Saskatchewan 231,632 (392,872); Alberta 514,811 (593,621) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-six weeks from August 1, 1937 to April 8, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 35,238,366 (19,336,681); Saskatchewan 23,900,228 (83,805,793); Alberta 53,222,435 (48,908,215) bushels. For the thirty-six weeks ending April 8, 1938 and April 9, 1937, 112,361,029 and 152,050,689 bushels respectively were received from the farms.



OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending April 8, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 599,006 bushels, while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 2,000 bushels. The total is 601,006 bushels as compared with 399,104 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 201,902 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 1,066,967 bushels.

The totals shown here include 32,000 bushels not shown in the weekly figures, but included in Broomhall's revised totals.

World shipments for the week ending April 9, 1938 amounted to 9,336,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,820,000 bushels for the previous week and 13,416,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from North America were smaller by 871,000 bushels than during the previous week. Argentine and Australian shipments also showed decreases of 653,000 and 104,000 bushels respectively.

During the first thirty-six weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 353.5 million bushels as compared with 436.3 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 132.4 million bushels as compared with 159.1 million bushels in 1936-37. Argentine shipments were only 46.9 million bushels this year as compared with 131 million bushels for the same period last year. Russian shipments amounted to 37.6 million bushels so far this season.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 8, 1938

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 8, 1938 show a net decrease of 558,358 bushels compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows: wheat 44,444,282, oats 9,238,367, barley 8,509,192, flaxseed 443,311 and rye 1,275,346 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 64,228, oats 296,857, barley 192,328, flaxseed 1,352 and rye 3,593 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows: wheat 30,777,022, oats 10,436,500, barley 10,739,559, flaxseed 688,801 and rye 1,931,152 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 1,394,000 bushels composed of wheat 1,073,000, oats 250,000, barley 65,000 and rye 6,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 12,561 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 16,840 and barley 18,982 bushels, while oat stocks decreased 23,261 bushels.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 279,799 bushels composed of wheat 212,380, oats 51,968 and barley 15,451 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net increase of 712,790 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 596,999, oats 1,296, barley 116,177 and rye 1,947 bushels, while flaxseed decreased 3,629 bushels.




