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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 14, 1938 decreased 684,550 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 33,943,169 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 43,759,732 bushels compared with 44,444,282 bushels for the previous week and 77,702,901 bushels for the week ending April 16, 1937. The stocks of 43,759,732 bushels include 14,395,543 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 911,173 bushels, a net decrease of 52,727 bushels from the previous week when 963,900 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 21,273; New York 242,000; Erie 571,000; and Albany 76,900 bushels. Decreases are noted at New York of 8,000 and Erie 45,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 12,041,387 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 1,881,387; Buffalo 2,686,000; Erie 1,347,000; New York 4,119,000; Albany 1,953,000 and Chicago 55,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 877,270 bushels for the above week. For the corresponding week last year no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending April 14, 1938 were 42,846,559 bushels compared with 43,480,382 bushels for the previous week and 65,661,514 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 12,062,000; Interior Terminals 4,807,677; Vancouver-New Westminster 1,162,877; Prince Rupert 292,279; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 14,767,977; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 5,016,430 and 1,621,630 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 1,573,000; Interior Private, Mill and Semi-Private Elevators 266,922; Vancouver-New Westminster 115,489; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 170,885 and 111,000 bushels respectively, while an increase is noted at the Head of the Lakes of 1,027,050 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 3,105,869 bushels for the week ending April 14, 1938 compared with 4,253,971 bushels for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 14, 1938 amounted to 1,139,422 bushels, a decrease of 741 bushels from the previous week when 1,140,163 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 946,356 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending April 14, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 412,725 (90,608); Saskatchewan 214,301 (472,146); Alberta 512,396 (383,602) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-seven weeks from August 1, 1937 to April 14, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 35,651,091 (19,427,289); Saskatchewan 24,114,529 (84,277,939); Alberta 53,734,831 (49,291,817) bushels. For the thirty-seven weeks ending April 14, 1938 and April 16, 1937, 113,500,451 and 152,997,045 bushels respectively were received from the farms.



OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending April 14, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 326,239 bushels, while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 4,000 bushels. The total is 330,239 bushels as compared with 601,006 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 270,767 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 1,862,837 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 15, 1938

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 15, 1938 show a decrease of 920,094 bushels compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 43,759,732, oats 9,032,463, barley 8,509,065, flaxseed 435,670 and rye 1,253,474 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 684,550, oats 205,904, barley 127, flaxseed 7,641 and rye 21,872 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 77,702,901, oats 9,496,548, barley 10,287,463, flaxseed 690,403 and rye 1,785,356 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 2,124,000 bushels composed of wheat 1,573,000, oats 365,000, barley 170,000, flaxseed 2,000 and rye 14,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 83,604 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 13,922 and oats 72,444 bushels, while barley increased 2,762 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 140,781 bushels composed of wheat 115,489, oats 6,347, barley 18,425 and rye 520 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net increase of 1,167,322 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 1,027,050, oats 14,992, barley 123,898 and rye 1,843 bushels, while flaxseed decreased 461 bushels.
