WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 22, 1938 decreased 279,078 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 32,191,845 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 43,480,654 bushels compared with 43,759,732 bushels for the previous week and 75,672,499 bushels for the week ending April 23, 1937. The stocks of 43,480,654 bushels include 14,326,601 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 804,900 bushels, a net decrease of 106,273 bushels from the previous week when 911,173 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 105,000; New York 106,000; Erie 517,000 and Albany 76,900 bushels. Decreases are noted at New York of 136,000 and Erie 54,000 bushels, while an increase is noted at Buffalo of 83,747 bushels. Stocks at Albany remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 11,213,633 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 1,734,633; Buffalo 2,318,000; Erie 1,071,000; New York 3,935,000; Albany 2,050,000 and Chicago 55,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 678,657 bushels for the above week. For the corresponding week last year no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending April 22, 1938 were 42,675,754 bushels compared with 42,848,559 bushels for the previous week and 64,358,866 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canada elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 11,277,000; Interior Terminals 4,509,954; Vancouver-New Westminster 1,013,594; Prince Rupert 292,279; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 14,606,009; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 4,441,132 and 1,466,395 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 785,000; Interior Private and Mill and Semi-Private Elevators 297,723; Vancouver-New Westminster 149,283; Head of the Lakes 161,968; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 575,298 and 155,235 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,891,569 bushels for the week ending April 22, 1938 compared with 5,969,749 bushels for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 22, 1938 amounted to 1,108,043 bushels, a decrease of 31,379 bushels from the previous week when 1,139,422 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 921,264 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending April 22, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 185,177 (63,899); Saskatchewan 276,581 (544,006); Alberta 646,285 (313,359) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-eight weeks from August 1, 1937 to April 22, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 35,836,268 (19,491,188); Saskatchewan 24,391,110 (84,821,945); Alberta 54,381,116 (49,605,176) bushels. For the thirty-eight weeks ending April 22, 1938 and April 23, 1937, 114,608,494 and 153,918,309 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending April 22, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 376,643 bushels, while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were nil. The total is 376,643 bushels as compared with 330,239 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 46,404 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 1,602,458 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending April 23, 1938 amounted to 9,790,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,114,000 bushels for the previous week and 13,208,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from North America and Argentina were slightly lower than during the previous week, while Australian shipments showed a decrease of 2,034,000 bushels.

During the first thirty-eight weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 375.6 million bushels as compared with 462.3 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 137.2 million bushels as compared with 164 million bushels in 1936-37. Argentine shipments were only 50.6 million bushels this year as compared with 142.5 million bushels for the same period last year. Russian shipments amounted to 38.7 million bushels so far this season.

CAMADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 22, 1938

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 22, 1938 show a net decrease of 708,219 bushels compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows: wheat 43,480,654, oats 8,727,501, barley 8,373,631, flaxseed 428,879, and ryo 1,271,520 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 279,078, oats 304,962, barley 135,434 and flaxseed 6,791 bushels, while rye increased 18,046 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows:wheat 75,672,499, cats 8,378,981, barley 9,733,439, flaxseed 686,872 and rye 1,658,214 bushels,

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: ...

Grain in store shows a decroase of 1,362,000 bushels composed of wheat 785,000; oats 285,000, barley 280,000, flaxsoud 6,000 and rye 6,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MILL ELEVATORS: ...

Grain stocks show a decrease of 175,000 bushels, Decreases were as follows: - wheat 105,000, cats 40,000, barley 28,000 and flaxseed 2,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS: Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 247,647 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 192,723 and oats 59,105 bushels while barley increased 4,181 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS: Grain stocks at these elevators show a not decrease of 134,668 bushels.

Decreases were noted in wheat of 149,283 and oats 32,922 bushels while barley increased 47,537 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:~ Wheat in store remains unchanged,

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR): Grain stocks show a not decrease of 96,803 bushels. Docreases were noted in wheat of 161,968, oats 20,061, flaxsood 1,136 and ryo 3,022 bushols, while barley increased 89,384 bushels.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - LAKE FORTS: -

Grain stocks for the week show a decrease of 660,358 bushels composed of wheat 575,298, oats 30,603, barley 53,012 and ryc 1,445 bushels.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - SEABOARD PORTS:-

Grain stocks for the week show a net decrease of 123,208 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 155,235 and barley 8,697 bushels, while cats increased 40,724 bushels.

IN TRANSIT RAIL:-

Grain in rail transit slows a net decrease of 200,497 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 214,300 and barley 43,827 bushels, while increases were shown in cats of 44,396, flaxseed 2,345 and ryo 10,889 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES:-

Grain in transit on the lakes amounted to wheat 2,166,002, oats 77,609, barley 137,000 and ryo 17,624 bushels. This is the first week since the opening of navigation this year that grain in transit lakes has been shown,


