WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 29, 1938 decreased 1,736,666 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 30,484,343 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 41,743,988 bushels compared with 43,480,654 bushels for the previous week and 72,228,331 bushels for the week ending April 30, 1937. The stocks of 41,743,988 bushels include 13,927,668 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 715,000 bushels, a net decrease of 89,900 bushels from the previous week when 804,900 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 210,000; New York 78,000 and Erie 427,000 bushels. Decreases are noted at New York of 28,000 and Erie 90,000 bushels, while an increase is noted at Buffalo of 105,000 bushels. Stocks at Albany amounting to 76,900 bushels were cleared out of the elevator.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 10,295,520 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 1,533,520; Buffalo 2,033,000; Erie 386,000; New York 4,241,000; Albany 2,050,000 and Chicago 52,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 746,485 bushels for the above week. For the corresponding week last year no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending April 29, 1938 were 41,028,988 bushels compared with 42,675,754 bushels for the previous week and 61,932,811 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 9,592,000; Interior Terminals 3,618,699; Vancouver-New Westminster 899,332; Prince Rupert 292,279; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 13,177,448; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 5,263,101 and 1,586,334 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 1,685,000; Interior Private and Mill and Semi-Private Elevators 891,255; Vancouver-New Westminster 114,262; Head of the Lakes 1,428,561; while the Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports increased 822,469 and 119,939 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 3,087,057 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 3,500,918 bushels for the week ending April 29, 1938 compared with 6,042,630 and 5,207,446 bushels for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 29, 1938 amounted to 1,168,120 bushels, an increase of 60,077 bushels from the previous week when 1,108,043 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 591,672 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending April 29, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 327,552 (21,619); Saskatchewan 266,832 (332,134); Alberta 573,736 (237,919) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-nine weeks from August 1, 1937 to April 29, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 36,163,820 (19,512,807); Saskatchewan 24,657,942 (85,154,079); Alberta 54,954,852 (49,843,095) bushels. For the thirty-nine weeks ending April 29, 1938 and April 30, 1937, 115,776,614 and 154,509,981 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending April 29, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 825,688 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 1,000 bushels. The total is 826,688 bushels as compared with 376,643 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 450,045 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 1,467,306 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending April 30, 1938 amounted to 12,609,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,790,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,432,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from North America and Australia were higher by 1,788,000 and 1,496,000 bushels, while Argentine shipments showed a decrease of 449,000 bushels as compared with the previous week.

During the first thirty-nine weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 388.2 million bushels as compared with 472.7 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 141.3 million bushels as compared with 167 million bushels in 1936-37. Argentine shipments were only 52 million bushels this year as compared with 145.1 million bushels last year. Australian shipments are higher by 17.3 million bushels than for the same period last year. Russian shipments amounted to 39.6 million bushels so far this season.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 29, 1938

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 29, 1938 show a decrease of 2,490,871 bushels compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows: wheat 41,743,988; oats 8,199,614; barley 8,204,528; flaxseed 417,135 and rye 1,225,549 bushels. Decreases were shown in wheat of 1,736,166; oats 527,887; barley 169,103; flaxseed 11,744 and rye 45,971 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows: wheat 72,228,331; oats 7,858,210; barley 8,712,280; flaxseed 704,228 and rye 1,843,147 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Grain in store shows a decrease of 2,016,000 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,685,000; oats 205,000; barley 105,000; flaxseed 3,000 and rye 18,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MILL ELEVATORS:-

Grain stocks show a decrease of 837,000 bushels composed of wheat 592,000; oats 166,000; barley 75,000 and flaxseed 4,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:-

Grain in store shows a decrease of 574,083 bushels, composed of wheat 299,255; oats 236,511 and barley 38,317 bushels.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:-

Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 130,338 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 114,262 and oats 59,354 bushels, while barley increased 43,278 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:-

Wheat in store remains the same as previous weeks.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):-

Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,875,841 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,428,561; barley 438,136; flaxseed 2,906 and rye 26,351 bushels while oats increased 20,113 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES:-

Grain in transit on the lakes shows a net increase of 1,824,744 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 1,334,916; oats 44,455 and barley 462,997 bushels, while rye decreased 17,624 bushels.

IN TRANSIT RAIL:-

Grain in rail transit shows a net increase of 208,034 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 195,488; oats 83,648 and rye 1,032 bushels, while barley and flaxseed decreased 69,296 and 1,838 bushels respectively.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - LAKE PORTS:-

Grain in store shows a net increase of 942,627 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 822,469 and barley 143,537 bushels, while oats and rye decreased 20,912 and 2,467 bushels respectively.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - SEABOARD PORTS:-

Grain stocks show a net increase of 91,886 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 119,939; oats 11,674 and rye 17,439 bushels, while barley decreased 57,166 bushels.
