WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 27, 1937, increased 7,710,031 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 96,691,047 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 38,479,062 bushels compared with 30,769,031 bushels for the previous week and 135,170,109 bushels for the week ending August 28, 1936. The stocks of 38,479,062 bushels includes 3,672,160 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,604,000 bushels, an increase of 3,000 bushels over the previous week when 2,601,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 185,000; New York 1,747,000 and Albany 672,000 bushels. A decrease is shown in the stocks at Buffalo of 51,000 bushels while New York reports an increase of 54,000 bushels. The stocks at Albany remained unchanged from the previous week, being 672,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 18,309,313 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 5,438,055; Buffalo 6,545,000; Erie 1,672,000; New York 1,645,258; Albany 2,874,000 and Chicago 135,000 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending August 27, 1937, amounted to 35,739,042 bushels compared with 28,032,011 bushels for the previous week and 116,860,796 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Country Elevators 9,970,000; Interior Terminals 3,160,424; Vancouver-New Westminster 3,169,320; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 10,587; Head of the Lakes 5,985,936; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 3,049,351 and 2,626,446 bushels respectively.

Increases over the previous week are shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 3,570,000; Interior Public & Semi-Public elevators 6,632; and Head of the Lakes 1,524,700 bushels; while decreases were noted at Interior Private & Mill Elevators of 25,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 73,108; Eastern Elevators, Lake ports 571,371 and Seaboard Ports 519,244 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 5,776,595 bushels for the week ending August 27, 1937, compared with 13,038,983 bushels for the same period last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 985,019 bushels against 3,375,210 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 13, 1937, amounted to 1,184,503 bushels, an increase of 981,850 bushels over the previous week when 202,653 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 6,188,208 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending August 13, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 311,372 (1,872,513); Saskatchewan 499,394 (3,290,883); Alberta 373,737 (1,024,812) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the two weeks from August 1 to 13 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 338,993 (2,066,433); Saskatchewan 593,043 (4,284,846); Alberta 455,120 (1,550,435) bushels. For the two weeks ending August 13, 1937 and August 14, 1936, 1,387,156 and 7,908,714 bushels were received from the farms.

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 20, 1937, amounted to 4,188,848 bushels, an increase of 3,004,345 bushels over the previous week when 1,184,503 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 10,787,812 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending August 20, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 2,461,409 (2,562,927); Saskatchewan 1,143,449 (6,532,721); Alberta 583,990 (1,662,164) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the three weeks from August 1 to 20 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 2,461,409 (4,629,360); Saskatchewan 1,736,492 (10,847,567); Alberta 1,039,110 (3,212,599) bushels. For the three weeks ending August 20, 1937 and August 21, 1936, 5,576,004 and 18,689,526 bushels were received from the farms.

EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

the week ending August 27, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,424,804 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 107,000 bushels. The total is 1,531,804 bushels as compared with 2,168,739 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 636,935 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 3,672,109 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending August 28, 1937 amounted to 7,825,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 7,533,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,744,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from North America showed a decrease from the previous week of 1,085,000 bushels while shipments from the Argentine and Australia showed increases of 102,000 and 523,000 bushels respectively.

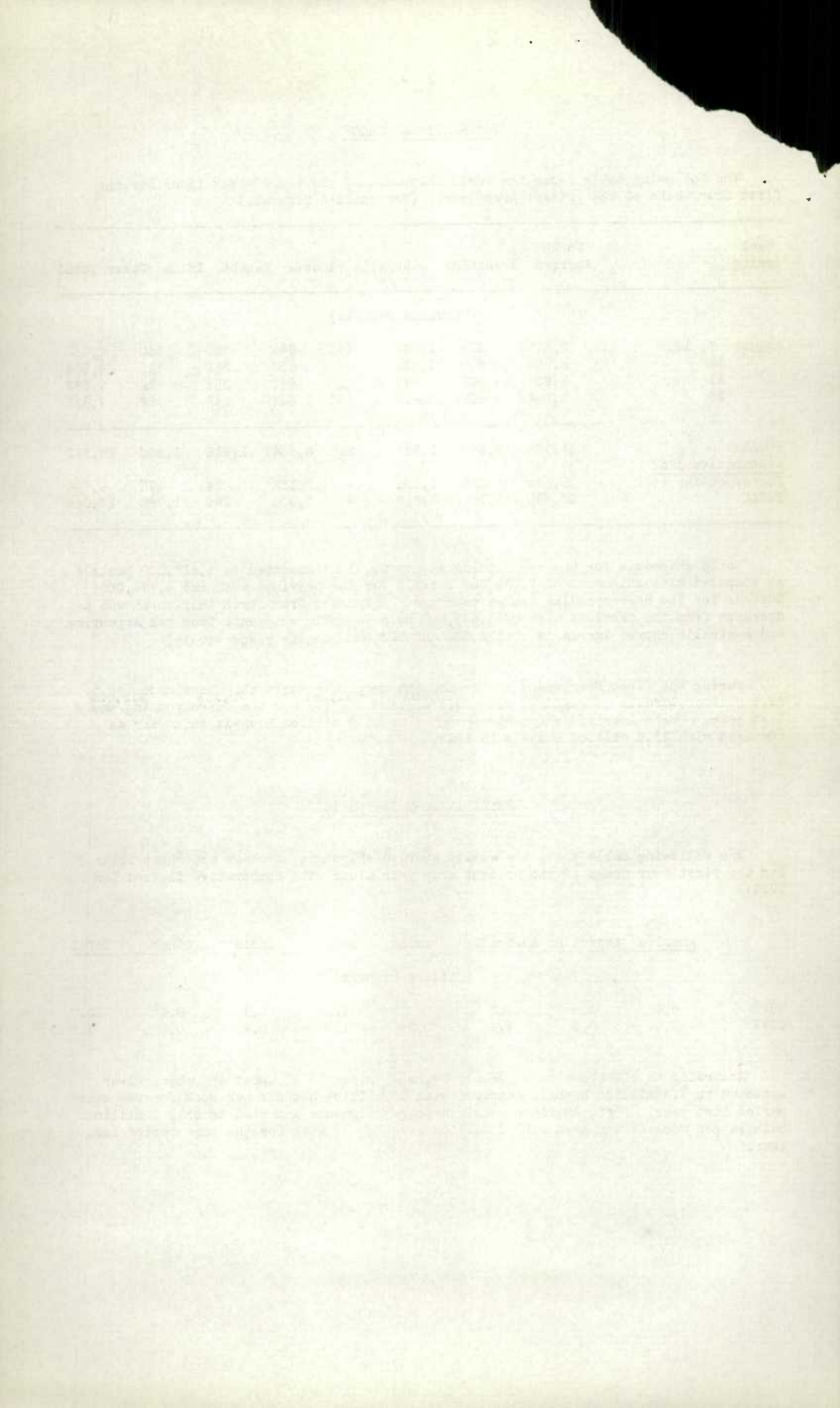
During the first four weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 28.9 million bushels as compared with 39.9 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 11.9 million bushels this year as compared with 23.8 million bushels in 1936.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 7.3 million bushels compared with 10 million bushels per week for the same period last year. North American weekly average shipments amounted to only 3 million bushels per week as compared with 6 million bushels per week for the same period last year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 27, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Aug. 27, 1937 show a net increase of 9,716,589 bushels compared with the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 38,479,062, oats 2,518,424, barley 6,240,382, flaxseed 376,549 and rye 902,403 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 7,710,031, oats 70,077, barley 1,786,292 and rye 151,450 bushels, while flaxseed decreased 1,261 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows: wheat 135,170,109, oats 10,167,922, barley 10,306,108, flaxseed 290,774 and rye 3,424,625 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows an increase of 4,105,000 bushels composed of wheat 3,570,000, oats 147,000, barley 345,000, flaxseed 3,000 and rye 40,000 bushels.
