WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 6, 1938 decreased 2,260,995 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 28,842,453 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported at 39,482,993 bushels compared with 41,743,988 bushels for the previous week and 68,325,446 bushels for the week ending May 7, 1937. The stocks of 39,482,993 bushels include 13,482,993 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 706,000 bushels, a net decrease of 9,000 bushels from the previous week when 715,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 207,000; New York 72,000 and Erie 427,000 bushels. Decreases are noted at New York of 6,000 and Buffalo 3,000 bushels, while the stocks at Erie remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 9,655,334 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 1,248,334; Buffalo 2,158,000; Erie 120,000; New York 4,332,000; Albany 1,746,000 and Chicago 51,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 823,493 bushels for the above week. For the corresponding week last year 39,979 bushels were reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending May 6, 1938 were 38,776,993 bushels compared with 41,028,988 bushels for the previous week and 58,670,112 bushels for the corresponding week last year.


Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 7,822,000; Interior terminals 3,239,175; Vancouver-New Westminster 849,340; Prince Rupert 292,279; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 12,660,449; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 5,514,136 and 3,372,106 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 1,770,000; Interior Private and Mill and Semi-Private Elevators 379,524; Vancouver-New Westminster 49,992; Head of the Lakes 516,999; while the Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports increased 251,035 and 1,785,771 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,914,474 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 2,101,215 bushels for the week ending May 6, 1938 compared with 5,089,778 and 3,101,522 bushels for the same period last year respectively.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 6, 1938 amounted to 688,700 bushels, a reduction of 479,420 bushels from the previous week when 1,168,120 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 757,888 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending May 6, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 123,982 (70,862); Saskatchewan 196,002 (378,623); Alberta 368,716 (308,403) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty weeks from August 1, 1937 to May 6, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 36,287,802 (19,583,669); Saskatchewan 24,853,944 (85,532,702); Alberta 55,323,568 (50,151,498) bushels. For the forty weeks ending May 6, 1938 and May 7, 1937, 116,465,314 and 155,267,869 bushels respectively were received from the farms.



OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES.

During the week ending May 6, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 495,023 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 2,000 bushels. The total is 497,023 bushels as compared with 826,688 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 329,665 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 2,282,477 bushels.



World shipments for the week ending May 7, 1938 amounted to 10,059,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,609,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,552,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from North America and Australia were lower by 405,000 and 1,532,000 bushels as compared with the previous week.


During the first forty weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 398.3 million bushels as compared with 483.3 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 145.1 million bushels as compared with 170 million bushels in 1936-37. Australian shipments are higher by 19 million bushels than for the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 6, 1938

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 6, 1938 show a decrease of 3,426,273 bushels compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows: wheat 39,482,993, oats 7,417,039, barley 7,837,741, flaxseed 413,942 and rye 1,212,826 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,260,995, oats 782,575, barley 366,787, flaxseed 3,193 and rye 12,723 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows: wheat 68,325,446, oats 6,609,556, barley 8,156,761, flaxseed 615,016 and rye 1,728,578 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Grain stocks show a decrease of 2,549,000 bushels, composed of wheat 1,770,000, oats 555,000, barley 190,000, flaxseed 8,000 and rye 26,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE & MILL ELEVATORS:-

Grain in store shows a net decrease of 630,000 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 375,000, oats 155,000, barley 98,000 and flaxseed 3,000 bushels, while rye increased 1,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:-

Grain stocks show a decrease of 36,998 bushels composed of wheat 4,524 and oats 32,474 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:-

Grain stocks show a net increase of 54,121 bushels. Increases were noted in oats of 52,015 and barley 52,668 bushels, while wheat and rye decreased 49,992 and 570 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:-

Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):-

Grain stocks show a net decrease of 748,952 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 516,999, oats 17,397, and barley 231,129 bushels, while flaxseed and rye decreased 3,003 and 13,570 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT LAKES:-

Grain in transit on the lakes show a net decrease of 1,200,007 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,399,703 and oats 37,664 bushels while barley increased 237,360 bushels.

IN TRANSIT RAIL:-

Grain in rail transit shows a net decrease of 303,558 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 172,583, oats 88,302, barley 46,754 and rye 723 bushels, while flaxseed increased 4,804 bushels.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - LAKE PORTS:-

Grain in store shows a net increase of 60 bushels. Wheat stocks increased 251,035 bushels, while oats and barley decreased 16,040 and 234,935 bushels respectively.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - SEABOARD PORTS:-

Grain stocks show an increase of 2,007,061 bushels, composed of wheat 1,785,771, oats 67,287 and barley 154,003 bushels.



LAKE SHIPMENTS FROM THE HEAD OF THE LAKES FOR THE PERIOD


