WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 13, 1938 decreased 1,250,115 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 25,817,360 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 38,332,878 bushels compared with 39,482,993 bushels for the previous week and 64,150,238 bushels for the week ending May 14, 1937. The stocks of 38,332,878 bushels include 13,595,627 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 516,000 bushels, a net decrease of 190,000 bushels from the previous week when 706,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 116,000; New York 58,000; and Erie 342,000 bushels. Decreases are noted at New York of 14,000, Buffalo 91,000 bushels, and Erie 85,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 8,439,052 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 1,078,052; Buffalo 2,179,000; Erie 120,000; New York 3,896,000; Albany 1,115,000 and Chicago 51,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 904,062 bushels for the above week. For the corresponding week last year 39,979 bushels were reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending May 13, 1938 were 37,816,878 bushels compared with 38,776,993 bushels for the previous week and 55,711,186 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 6,416,000; Interior Terminals 3,245,370; Vancouver-New Westminster 766,766; Prince Rupert 148,545; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 12,212,931; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 6,070,183 and 3,782,121 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 1,406,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 82,574; Head of the Lakes 447,518; and Prince Rupert 143,734 bushels; while the Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports showed increases of 556,047 and 410,016 bushels respectively and the Interior Public and Semi-Public elevators 6,195 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,805,874 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 2,357,268 bushels for the week ending May 13, 1938 compared with 3,789,239 and 2,719,610 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 13, 1938 amounted to 539,103 bushels, a reduction of 149,597 bushels from the previous week when 688,700 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 896,999 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending May 13, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 161,234 (61,347); Saskatchewan 169,809 (548,323); Alberta 208,060 (287,329) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-one weeks from August 1, 1937 to May 13, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 36,449,036 (19,645,016); Saskatchewan 25,023,753 (86,081,025); Alberta 55,531,628 (50,438,827) bushels. For the forty-one weeks ending May 13, 1938 and May 14, 1937, 117,004,417 and 156,164,868 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending May 13, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 761,315 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 3,000 bushels. The total is 764,315 bushels as compared with 497,023 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 267,292 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 3,328,804 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 13, 1938

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 13, 1938 show a decrease of 2,018,556 bushels compared with the previous week. Grain Stocks were as follows: wheat 38,332,878, oats 6,619,133, barley 7,791,244, flaxseed 410,076, and rye 1,192,654 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,150,115, oats 797,906, barley 46,497, flaxseed 3,866 and rye 20,172 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain stocks were as follows: wheat 64,150,238, oats 5,743,347, barley 7,453,312, flaxseed 526,441 and rye 1,454,973 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Grain stocks show a decrease of 2,470,000 bushels, composed of wheat 1,406,000, oats 800,000, barley 235,000, flaxseed 15,000 and rye 14,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MILL ELEVATORS:-

Grain in store shows a decrease of 107,000 bushels. Decreases were noted in oats of 51,000, barley 50,000, and rye 6,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:-

Grain stocks show a net decrease of 74,444 bushels. Decreases were noted in oats of 53,215 and barley 27,424 bushels, while wheat increased 6,195 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:-

Grain in store shows a net decrease of 81,146 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 82,574 and oats 17,125 bushels, while barley increased 18,553 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR:-

Wheat stocks show a decrease of 143,734 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR:-

Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

FORT WILLIAM - PORT ARTHUR:-

Grain stocks show a net decrease of 866,620 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 447,518, oats 5,329, barley 330,347 and rye 84,984 bushels, while flaxseed increased 1,558 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES:-

Grain in transit on the lakes shows a net increase of 70,988 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 256,053, oats 14,834 and rye 90,793 bushels, while barley decreased 290,692 bushels.

IN TRANSIT RAIL:-

Grain in rail transit shows a net increase of 306,361 bushels. Increases were noted in oats of 182,450, barley 216,499, flaxseed 9,576 and rye 6,436 bushels, while wheat decreased 108,600 bushels.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - LAKE PORTS:-

Grain stocks show a net increase of 719,084 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 556,047, and barley 208,602 bushels, while oats and rye decreased 42,220 and 3,345 bushels respectively.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - SEABOARD PORTS:-

Grain in store shows a net increase of 827,955 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 410,016 and barley 453,312 bushels while oats and rye decreased 26,301 and 9,072 bushels respectively.

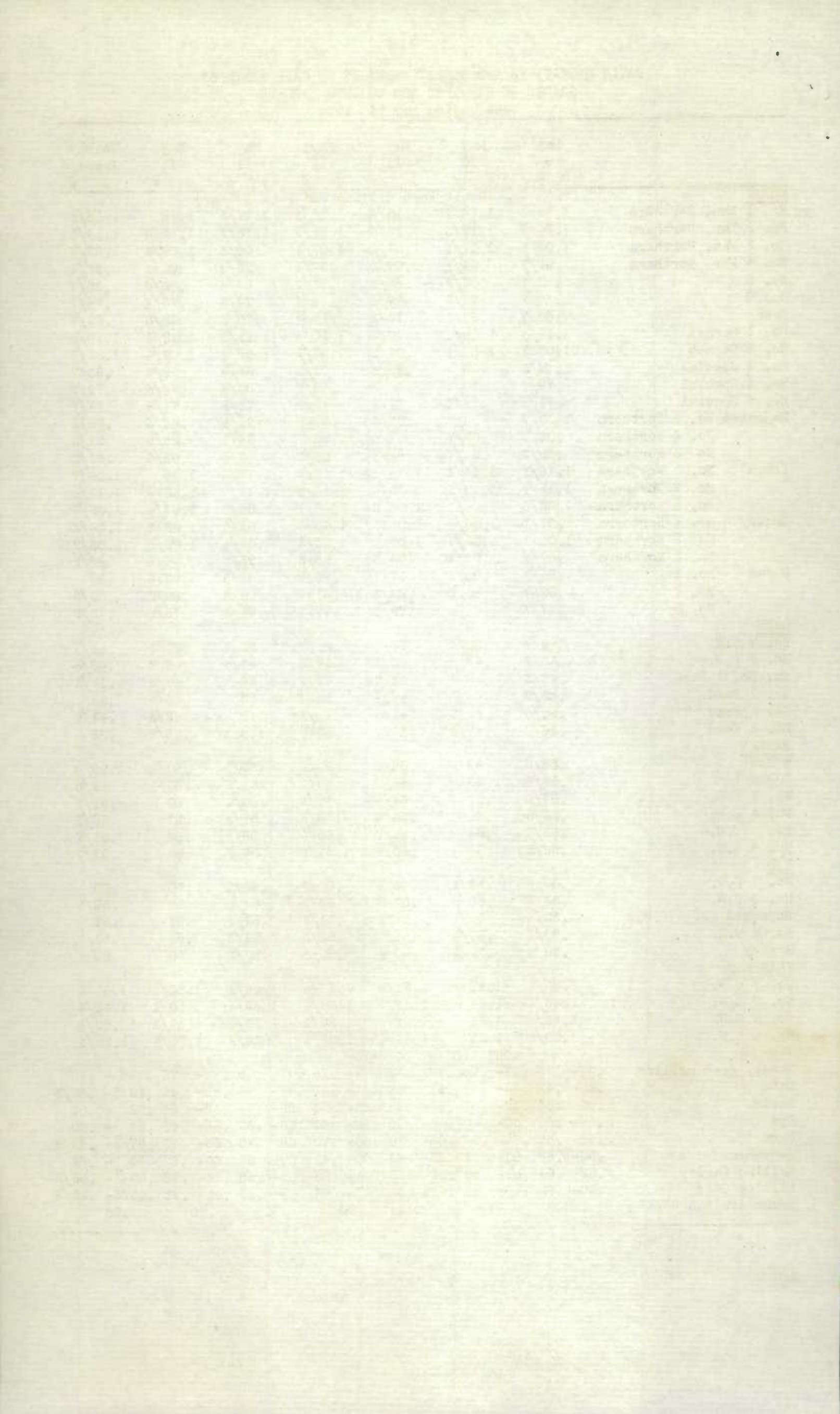
