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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 3, 1938, decreased 2,749,168 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 25,712,055 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 29,602,244 bushels compared with 32,351,412 bushels for the previous week and 55,314,299 bushels for the week ending June 4, 1937. The stocks of 29,602,244 bushels include 11,229,313 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 681,000 bushels, an increase of 20,000 bushels over the previous week when 661,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 186,000; New York 137,000 and Erie 358,000 bushels. An increase is shown at New York of 20,000 bushels while stocks at Erie and Buffalo remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 6,456,978 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 761,978; Chicago 39,000; Erie 213,000; Buffalo 1,648,000; Albany 1,120,000 and New York 2,808,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 1,056,646 bushels for the above week. For the corresponding week last year no United States grain was in store.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending June 3, 1938 were 28,921,244 bushels compared with 31,690,412 bushels for the previous week and 48,857,321 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 4,638,000; Interior Terminals 2,184,754; Vancouver-New Westminster 682,161; Prince Rupert 148,545; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 9,465,417; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 5,550,493 and 2,413,536 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week are shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 164,000; Interior Terminals 480,327; Vancouver-New Westminster 30,262; Head of the Lakes 2,627,980 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 646,035, while Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports increased 395,445 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 580,090 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 3,246,428 bushels for the week ending June 3, 1938 compared with 1,550,107 and 3,239,207 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 3, 1938 amounted to 843,205 bushels, an increase of 88,447 bushels over the previous week when 754,758 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,395,125 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending June 3, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 299,299 (168,743); Saskatchewan 176,000 (779,544); Alberta 367,906 (446,838) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-four weeks from August 1, 1937 to June 3, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 37,143,317 (19,989,574); Saskatchewan 25,539,817 (88,080,229); Alberta 56,520,092 (51,539,152) bushels. For the forty-four weeks ending June 3, 1938 and June 4, 1937, 119,208,096 and 159,608,955 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

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OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending June 3, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,932,728 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 32,000 bushels. The total is 1,964,728 bushels as compared with 2,837,443 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 972,715 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 666,756 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending June 4, 1938 amounted to 8,473,000 bushels, as compared with shipments of 9,060,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,704,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments were lower this week showing a decrease of 1,165,000 bushels.

During the first forty-four weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 434.4 million bushels as compared with 532.7 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 161 million bushels as compared with 185.8 million bushels in 1936-37.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS FOR WEEK ENDING JUNE 3, 1938

Returns received of stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 3, 1938 show a decrease of 4,409,962 bushels compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were: wheat 29,602,244; oats 4,301,008; barley 6,019,537; flaxseed 362,131 and rye 1,126,706 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,749,168; oats 865,086; barley 766,948; flaxseed 25,047 and rye 3,713 bushels.

At a comparable date last year grain in store was: wheat 55,314,299; oats 4,550,418; barley 6,101,849; flaxseed 544,814 and rye 631,820 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Grain stocks show a decrease of 811,000 bushels, composed of wheat 164,000; oats 395,000; barley 230,000; flaxseed 7,000 and rye 15,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MILL ELEVATORS:-

Grain in store shows a decrease of 690,000 bushels. Decreases were as follows: wheat 480,000; oats 125,000; barley 81,000; flaxseed 3,000 and rye 1,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:-

Grain stocks show a decrease of 32,221 bushels composed of wheat 327; oats 31,191 bushels and barley 703 bushels.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:-

Stocks of grain showed a net increase of 10,455 bushels. Increases were noted in barley of 51,710 bushels and rye 2,980 bushels, while decreases were shown for wheat of 30,262 and oats 13,973 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:-

Wheat in store remained unchanged.

FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR:-

Grain in store showed a net decrease of 2,335,788 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,627,980 and flaxseed 41,302 bushels. Increases occurred in stocks of oats, barley and rye. The amounts were 143,437, 180,560 and 9,497 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT - LAKES:-

Grain in transit on the lakes increased 1,659,222 bushels composed of 1,659,078 bushels of wheat; 44,050 bushels of oats and 56,094 of flaxseed. Decreases were noted in barley of 176,624 and rye of 6,784 bushels.

IN TRANSIT - RAIL:-

A net decrease of 2,151,543 bushels was shown for stocks in store, composed of 1,376,267 bushels of wheat and 519,849 bushels of oats. Barley and flaxseed also showed decreases of 233,880 and 22,008 bushels. A small increase occurred in rye of 461 bushels.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - LAKE PORTS:-

Grain stocks showed a net increase of 439,222 bushels. Increases were noted in stocks of wheat of 646,035 bushels and oats 4,603 bushels, while decreases of 199,013 bushels of barley, 7,831 of flaxseed and 4,572 bushels of rye for the same period.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - SEABOARD PORTS:-

Stocks of grain show a net decrease of 424,253 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 395,445 bushels and barley of 67,350 bushels. Increases were shown in oats of 27,837 bushels and rye 10,705 bushels.

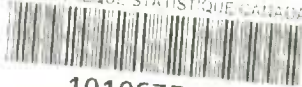
