WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 10, 1938, decreased 427,552 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 22,144,134 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 29,174,692 bushels compared with 29,602,244 bushels for the previous week and 51,318,826 bushels for the week ending June 11, 1937. The stocks of 29,174,692 bushels include 11,011,302 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 892,000 bushels, an increase of 211,000 bushels over the previous week when 681,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 141,000; New York 137,000; Erie 383,000 and Albany 231,000 bushels. A decrease is shown in the Buffalo stocks of 45,000 bushels, while increases were noted at Erie of 25,000 and Albany 231,000 bushels. Stocks at New York remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 6,028,978 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 729,978; Chicago 27,000; Buffalo 1,326,000; Albany 1,120,000 and New York 2,692,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 787,122 bushels for the above week while for the corresponding week last year 91,637 bushels of United States grain were in store.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending June 10, 1938 were 28,282,692 bushels compared with 28,921,244 bushels for the previous week and 45,289,848 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 4,696,000; Interior Terminals 2,073,069; Vancouver-New Westminster 675,191; Prince Rupert 148,545; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 8,191,666; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 6,804,772 and 2,798,580 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week are shown at the following elevators: Interior Terminals 111,685; Vancouver-New Westminster 6,970; Head of the Lakes 1,273,751; while increases are noted at Western Country Elevators of 58,000; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,254,279 and Seaboard Ports 385,044 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,067,095 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 1,380,782 bushels for the week ending June 10, 1938 compared with 1,827,065 and 2,105,670 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 10, 1938 amounted to 743,591 bushels, a decrease of 99,614 bushels over the previous week when 843,205 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 891,268 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending June 10, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 122,516 (90,927); Saskatchewan 220,620 (517,395); Alberta 400,455 (282,946) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-five weeks from August 1, 1937 to June 10, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 37,271,333 (20,080,501); Saskatchewan 25,759,807 (88,597,624); Alberta 56,920,547 (51,822,098) bushels. For the forty-five weeks ending June 10, 1938 and June 11, 1937, 119,951,687 and 160,500,223 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending June 10, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,131,485 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 10,000 bushels. The total is 1,141,485 bushels as compared with 1,964,728 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 823,243 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 2,893,819 bushels.



World shipments for the week ending June 11, 1938 amounted to 11,806,000 bushels, as compared with shipments of 8,473,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,136,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Australian shipments were higher this week showing increases of 1,395,000 and 2,343,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week.

During the first forty-five weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 446.2 million bushels as compared with 542.9 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 166.3 million bushels as compared with 189.9 million bushels in 1936-37.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS FOR WEEK ENDING JUNE 10, 1938

Returns received of stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 10, 1938 show a decrease of 1,237,531 bushels, compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows: wheat 29,174,692; oats 3,935,902; barley 5,598,796; flaxseed 352,538 and rye 1,112,167 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 427,552; oats 365,106; barley 420,741; flaxseed 9,593 and rye 14,539 bushels.

At a comparable date last year grain in store was as follows: wheat 51,318,826; oats 4,301,535; barley 5,768,454; flaxseed 535,294 and rye 496,291 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Grain stocks show a net increase of 6,000 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 58,000 bushels and barley 15,000 bushels, while oats, flaxseed and rye decreased 55,000; 2,000 and 10,000 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MILL ELEVATORS:-

Grain in store in these elevators show a decrease of 355,000 bushels, composed of wheat 105,000 bushels; oats 126,000 bushels; barley 116,000 bushels and flaxseed 8,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:-

Decreases in stocks were as follows: wheat 6,685 bushels, oats 5,551 and barley 1,943 bushels making a total of 14,179 bushels as compared with the stocks of the previous week.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER:-

In these elevators stocks of grain showed a decrease of 101,556 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 6,970 bushels, barley 104,313 bushels and rye 40 bushels, while oats showed an increase of 9,767 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:-

Wheat in store still remained unchanged.

FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR:-

Grain in store showed a total decrease of 1,546,885 bushels. The amounts were: wheat 1,273,751 bushels; oats 64,957; barley 126,989; flaxseed 2,781 and rye 78,407 bushels.

IN TRANSIT - LAKES:-


Grain in transit on the lakes decreased 1,515,675 bushels and were as follows:- wheat 1,430,474; oats 234,652; flaxseed 56,094 bushels. Increases were shown in barley of 132,277 bushels and rye 73,268 bushels.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - LAKE PORTS:-

A net increase of 1,188,428 bushels was noted composed of wheat 1,254,279 bushels; oats 48,191 and flaxseed 56,031 bushels. Decreases were shown for barley and rye of 158,806 and 11,267 bushels respectively.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - SEABOARD PORTS:-

Stocks of grain showed a net increase of 452,024 bushels and were as follows: wheat 385,044; oats 102,132 and rye 8,119 bushels, while barley decreased by 43,271 bushels.




