WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 17, 1938 decreased 1,510,420 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 20,629,933 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 27,664,272 bushels compared with 29,174,692 bushels for the previous week and 48,294,205 bushels for the week ending June 18, 1937. The stocks of 27,664,272 bushels include 10,845,106 bushels of Durum wheat,

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 927,000 bushels, an increase of 35,000 bushels over the previous week when 892,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 139,000; New York 109,000; Erie 408,000 and Albany 271,000 bushels. A decrease is shown in the Buffalo stocks of 2,000 bushels and in New York stocks of 28,000 bushels, while increases were noted at Erie of 25,000 and Albany 40,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,944,294 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 688,294; Chicago 27,000; Buffalo 1,519,000; Albany 970,000; New York 2,546,000 and Erie Canal 194,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 795,577 bushels for the above week while for the corresponding week last year 43,127 bushels of United States grain were in store.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending June 17, 1938 were 26,737,272 bushels compared with 28,282,692 bushels for the previous week and 42,349,911 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 4,591,000; Interior Terminals 1,853.215; Vancouver-New Westminster 650,596; Prince Rupert 400; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 7,560,107; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 6,190,802 and 3,164,762 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week are shown in the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 105,000; Interior Elevators 219,854; Vancouver-New Westminster 24,595; Prince Rupert 148,145; Fort William and Port Arthur 631,559; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 613,970 and 3,633,818 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 967,147 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 1,457,898 bushels for the week ending June 17, 1938 compared with 1,547,789 and 2,303,117 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

PRIMIRY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 17, 1938 amounted to 806,445 bushels, an increase of 62,854 bushels over the previous week when 743,591 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 701,993 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending June 17, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 111,435 (95,974); Saskatchewan 314,750 (382,558); Alberta 380,260 (223,461) bushels. Marketings in the three Preirie Provinces for the forty-six weeks from August 1, 1937 to June 17, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 37,382,768 (20,176,475); Saskatchewan 26,074,557 (88,980,182); Alberta 57,300,807 (52,045,559) bushels. For the forty-six weeks ending June 17, 1938 and June 18, 1937, 120,758,132 and 161,202,216 bushels respectively were received from the farms,

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the woek ending June 17, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,812,158 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 9,000 bushels. The total is 1,821,158 bushels as compared with 1,141,485 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 679,673 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 1,497,445 bushels.

The accumulated totals of imports of wheat into the United States for consumption and milling in bond are adjusted at the end of the month, due to the fact that the United States Department of Domestic and Foreign Commerce revises their weekly figures on a monthly basis.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS FOR THE WEEK ENDING JUNE 17, 1938

Returns received of stocks of grain in store for the week of June 17, 1938 decreased 1,510,420 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 20,629,933 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1937. Grain stocks were: wheat 27,664,272, oats 3,692,545, barley 5,251,487, flaxseed 346,869 and rye 1,138,632 bushels.

At a comparable date last year grain in store was: wheat 48,294,205, oats 4,269,252, barley 5,133,664, flaxseed 523,433 and rye 446,693 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Grain stocks show a decrease of 208,000 bushels composed of 105,000 bushels of wheat, oats 35,000, barley 60,000, flaxseed 3,000 and rye 5,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MILL:-

Grain in store showed a decrease of 217,000 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 119,000, cats 49,000, barley 43,000 and flaxseed 6,000 bushels, while the amount of rye was unchanged.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC:-

Grain stocks show a decrease of 108,773 bushels composed of wheat 100,854, oats 5,260 and barley 2,659 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER:-

Decreases were also noted in these elevators of 100,379 bushels for the week and were as follows: wheat 24,595, oats 4,310, barley 70,203 and rye 1,271 bushels while flaxseed remained the same.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:-

Stocks in Prince Rupert elevator decreased 148,145 bushels. There was no change in the amount in Churchill.

FORT WILLIAM - PORT ARTHUR:-

Grain in store showed a net decrease of 1,205,286 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 631,559, oats 213,995, barley 352,651 and rye 10,310 bushels, while flaxseed showed an increase of 3,229 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES:-

Grain in transit on the lakes increased 202,647 bushels composed of 138,341 bushels of oats, 126,944 bushels of barley and 40,000 bushels of flaxseed. Wheat and rye decreased 68,531 and 34,107 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT RAIL:-

A net decrease of 93,424 bushels was shown for stocks in store. The decreases were: wheat 99,948 and barley 72,558 bushels. Increases were: oats 15,101, flaxseed 102 and rye 63,879 bushels respectively.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - LAKE PORTS:-

Grain stocks showed a decrease of 802,531 bushels. Wheat decreased 613,970, oats 74,467, barley 69,652, flaxseed 40,000 and rye 4,442 bushels.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - SEABOARD: -

Stocks of grain showed a net decrease of 3,434,399 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,510,420, cats 243,357, barley 347,309 and flaxseed 5,669 bushels, while rye increased 26,465 bushels.




