#### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 24, 1938 decreased 1,169,967 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 19,107,186 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 26,544,305 bushels compared with 27,714,272 bushels from the previous week and 45,651,491 bushels for the week ending June 25, 1937. The stocks of 26,544,305 bushels include 10,418,534 bushels of Durum wheat.

## CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 840,000 bushels, a decrease of 137,000 bushels from the previous week when 977,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 179,000; New York 82,000; Erie 308,000 and Albany 271,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in the New York stocks of 77,000 bushels and in Erie stocks of 100,000 bushels, while an increase is noted at Buffalo of 40,000 bushels. Stocks at Albany remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,538,018 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 698,018; Chicago 27,000; Buffalo 1,210,000; Albany 1,005,000; New York 2,554,000 and Erie Canal 44,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 716,874 bushels for the above week while for the corresponding week last year 59,120 bushels of United States grain were in store.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending June 24, 1938 were 25,704,305 bushels compared with 26,737,272 bushels for the previous week and 40,113,473 bushels for the corresponding week last year.


Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 4,536,000; Interior Terminals 1,537,687; Vancouver-New Westminster 637,990; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 7,631,331; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 6,303,979 and 3,273,287 bushels respectively.

Decreases in stocks from those of the previous week are shown in the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 55,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 339,528; Vancouver-New Westminster 12,606 and Prince Rupert 400 bushels, while increases were noted at Interior Private and Mill Elevators of 24,000 and Eastern Elevators Lake and Scaboard Ports 113,177 and 108,525 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,267,963 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 1,882,506 bushels for the week ending June 24, 1938 compared with 1,917,757 and 1,882,506 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

#### PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat markotings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 24, 1938 amounted to 1,017,121 bushels, an increase of 210,676 bushels over the previous week when 806,445 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 722,270 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending June 24, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 189,086 (86,685); Saskatchewan 396,931 (386,396); Alberta 431,104 (249,189) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-seven weeks from August 1, 1937 to June 24, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 37,571,854 (20,263,160); Saskatchewan 26,471,488 (89,366,578); Alberta 57,731,911 (52,294,748) bushels. For the forty-seven weeks ending June 24, 1938 and June 25, 1937, 121,775,253 and 161,924,486 bushels respectively were received from the farms.



# OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

- 1A -

During the week ending June 24, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 867,578 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 32,000 bushels. The total is 899,578 bushels as compared with 1,821,158 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 921,580 bushels, and when com-

pared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 1,457,129 bushels. Clearances by ports for the weeks ending June 24, 1938 and June 25, 1937 and imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were as follows (in bushels):-





World shipments for the week ending June 25, 1938 amounted to 6,972,000 bushels, as compared with shipments of 8,528,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,448,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. During the first forty-seven weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 461.6 million bushels as compared with 561 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. ## CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS FOR WEEK ENDING JUNE 24, 1938

Returns received of stocks of grain in store for the week of June 24, 1938 decreased 1,425,215 bushels compared with the provious week and decreased 28,794,564 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1937. Grain stocks were wheat 26,544,305; cats 3,656,757; barley 5,145,976; flaxsood 332,936 and ryo 1,038,616 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain in store was wheat 45,651,491; cats 4,033,040; barley 4,819,818; flaxsood 539,716 and ryo 294,804 bushels.

#### WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS :-

Grain stocks show a decrease of 129,000 bushels composed of 55,000 bushels of wheat; oats 30,000; barley 25,000; flaxsed 7,000 and ryo 12,000 bushels.

#### INTERIOR PRIVATE & MILL: -

Grain in store showed a decrease of 32,000 bushels. Decreases were noted in barley of 64,000 bushels and flaxseed 5,000 bushels, while wheat and eats increased 24,000 and 13,000 bushels respectively. The amount of rye remained unchanged.

#### INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC:-

Grain stocks showed a decrease of 346,711 bushels composed of wheat 339,528 and eats 5,601 and barley 1,582 bushels.

#### VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER: -

Decreases were also noted in these elevators of 172,074 bushels for the week and were as follows: wheat 12,606; eats 24,556; barley 134,912 bushels. The amounts of flaxsoed and rye were unchanged.

#### PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS :--

Stocks in Princo Rupert elevator decreased 400 bushels.

Thorc was no change in the amount in Churchill.

## FORT WILLIAM - PORT ARTHUR :-

Grain in store showed a not increase of 136,939 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 71,224 and barley 131,212 bushels. Decreases were noted in oats of 51,640; flaxseed 746 and 13,111 bushels of rye.

## IN TRANSIT - LAKES :-

Grain in transit on the lakes decreased 1,942,694 bushels. The amounts were wheat, 1,243,175; eats 19,843; barley 608,330; flaxsood 23,969 and rye 47,377 bushels.

#### IN TRANSIT - RAIL:-

A net increase of 579,469 bushels was shown for the week in stocks in transit. The increases wore: wheat 300,816; eats 77,165 and barley 266,966 bushels, while flaxseed and rye decreased 1,135 and 64,343 bushels respectively.


#### EASTERN ELEVATORS LAKE PORTS :-

Grain stocks showed a net increase of 372,742 bushels. Meat increased 113,177 bushels; barley and rye 285,178 and 8,470 bushels while cats and flaxseed decreased 18,052 and 16,031 bushels respectively.

# EASTERN ELEVATORS SEABOARD PORTS :-

Stocks of grain increased 245,514 bushels for this wock. The amounts were: wheat 108,525; cats 23,739; barloy 44,957; flaxscod 39,948 and rye 28,345 bushels.
