#### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 1, 1938 decreased 659,922 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 17,125,851 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 25,884,383 bushels compared with 26,544,305 bushels from the previous week and 43,010,234 bushels for the week ending July 2, 1937. The stocks of 25,884,383 bushels include 10,258,288 bushels of Durum wheat.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 841,000 bushels, an increase of 1,000 bushels from the previous week when 840,000 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 230,000; New York 62,000; Erie 278,000 and Albany 271,000 bushels. An increase is shown in the Buffalo stocks of 51,000 bushels over those of a week ago, while decreases are noted in New York of 20,000 and Erie 30,000 bushels. Stocks at Albany remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,314,614 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 653,614; Chicago 7,000; Buffalo 1,159,000; Albany 1,005,000; New York 2,463,000 and Erie Canal 27,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 690,171 bushels for the above week while for the corresponding week last year 59,140 bushels of United States grain were in store.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending July 1, 1938 were 25,043,383 bushels compared with 25,704,305 bushels for the previous week and 37,695,620 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 4,567,000; Interior Terminals 1,549,779; Vancouver-New Westminster 632,653; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 7,653,314; Eastern Elevators, Lake and Seaboard Ports 5,978,688 and 2,602,750 bushels respectively.

Increases are shown in the stocks over those of the previous week at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 31,000; Interior Private and Mill Elevators 108,000 and Fort William and Port Arthur 21,983. Decreases were noted at the following: Interior Public and Semi-Public elevators 95,908; Eastern Elevators lake and Seaboard Ports 87,494 and 670,537 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,347,196 bushels and the amount in transit on the Lakes was 466,611 bushels for the week ending July 1, 1938 compared with 2,627,720 and 1,144,277 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

#### PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending July 1, 1938 amounted to 697,371 bushels, a decrease of 319,750 bushels from the previous week when 1,017,121 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 510,865 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending July 1, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 159,815 (84,132); Saskatchewan 260,747 (237,874); Alberta 276,809 (188,859) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-eight weeks from August 1, 1937 to July 1, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 37,731,669 (20,347,292); Saskatchewan 26,732,235 (90,050,619); Alberta 58,008,720 (52,483,607) bushels. For the forty-eight weeks ending July 1, 1938 and July 2, 1937, 122,472,624 and 162,435,351 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

#### OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending July 1, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,022,315 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 20,000 bushels. The total is 1,042,315 bushels as compared with 899,578 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 142,737 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 1,862,399 bushels.





World shipments for the week ending July 2, 1938 amounted to 10,367,000 bushels, as compared with shipments of 6,972,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,376,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. During the first forty-eight weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 472 million bushels as compared with 570.4 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 174.7 million bushels as compared with 201.2 million bushels in 1936-37.

#### CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WHEN ENDING JULY 1, 1938

Returns received of stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 1, 1938 decreased 1,003,093 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 16,414,537 bushels when compared with the corresponding week a year ago. Grain stocks were: wheat 25,844,383; oats 3,600,505; barley 4,912,768; flaxseed 301,471 and rye 1,016,570 bushels. The total was 35,715,497 bushels.

At a comparable date last year grain in store was: wheat 43,010,234; oats 3,832,261; barley 4,434,869; flaxsed 544,575 and rye 308,095 bushels.

#### WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Grain stocks show a net increase of 15,000 bushels composed of 31,000 bushels of wheat and 25,000 bushels of barloy while oats and rye decreased 40,000 and 1,000 bushels respectively.

#### INTERIOR PRIVATE AND MILL:-

Grain in store showed a net decrease of 51,000 bushels. Decreases were noted in oats of 19,000 bushels; barley 140,000 while wheat increased 108,000 bushels. The amounts of flaxscod and ryo remained unchanged.

#### INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-FUBLIC:-

Grain stocks showed a decrease of 95,914 bushels of which 95,908 were of wheat; 6 of oats and the amount of barley remained unchanged.

#### VANCOUVER-NEW LESTMINSTER:-

Decreases were also noted in these elevators of 63,412 bushels for the past week and were as follows:- wheat 5,337; oats 5,912; barley 52,043 and ryo 120 bushels. There was no change in the amount of flaxseed.

#### CHURCHILL:-

The amount of wheat in this elevator remained unchanged for the past weck.

#### FORT WILLIAM & PORT ARTHUR:-

Grain in store showed a not decrease of 186,682 bushels. Barley decreased 158,718 bushels; flaxseed 12,180; and rye 73,446 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 21,983 bushels and also in oats of 35,679 bushels.

#### IN TRANSIT - LAKES:-

Grain in transit on the lakes increased 513,235 bushels. The amounts of the decreases were: - oats 127,799 and flaxseed 2,092 bushels, while increases were noted in wheat of 195,935; barley 369,691 and rye 77,500 bushels.

#### IN TRANSIT - RAIL:-


A net decrease of 87,494 bushels was shown for the week in stocks in rail-transit. Docreases were: barley 223,420 and rye 2,864 bushels while wheat, oats and flaxsood increased 79,233; 52,801 and 6,756 bushels respectively.

#### EASTERN ELEVATORS-LAKE PORTS:-

Grain stocks showed a decrease of 514,637 bushels for the week. The amounts were: wheat 325,291; oats 11,529; barley 175,930 and rye 1,887 bushels.

#### EASTERN ELEVATORS-SEABOARD PORTS:-

A net decrease of 553,189 bushels was shown in these stocks and were: - wheat 670,537; flaxseed 23,949 and rye 40,429 bushels. Increases were shown in oats of 59,514 bushels and barley of 122,212 bushels.
