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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 29, 1938 decreased 2,064,235 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 13,575,962 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 19,709,319 bushels compared with 21,773,554 bushels for the previous week and 33,285,281 bushels for the week ending July 30, 1937. The stocks of 19,709,319 bushels include 8,393,255 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 983,000 bushels, an increase of 184,000 bushels over the previous week when 799,000 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 607,000; Erie 219,000; New York 112,000 and Albany 45,000 bushels. Buffalo increased 346,000 bushels, while Erie and New York decreased 154,000 and 8,000 bushels respectively. Albany remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 4,111,290 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 474,290; Buffalo 660,000; New York 2,060,000 and Albany 917,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada increased to 327,722 bushels over 287,845 bushels for the previous week, while for the same week last year 122,892 bushels were in store.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending July 29, 1938 were 18,726,319 bushels compared with 20,974,554 bushels for the previous week and 29,173,991 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 1,575,000; Interior Terminals 1,671,087; Vancouver-New Westminster 74,928; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 7,615,259; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 2,990,619 and 2,015,416 bushels respectively.

Decreases are shown in the stocks from the previous week at the following elevators: Western Country 735,000; Interior Private and Mill 292,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 9,616; Fort William and Port Arthur 163,613. Increases were noted at the Interior Public and Semi-Public elevators of 708, and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 124,092 and 103,090 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail Transit amounted to 1,635,832 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 1,136,358 bushels for the week ending July 29, 1938 compared with 1,364,211 and 1,542,782 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending July 29, 1938 amounted to 580,336 bushels, a decrease of 65,492 bushels over the previous week when 645,828 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 612,671 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending July 29, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 186,418 (74,958); Saskatchewan 174,708 (331,021); Alberta 219,210 (206,692) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the fifty-two weeks from August 1, 1937 to July 29, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 38,315,314 (20,721,431); Saskatchewan 27,788,346 (91,129,285); Alberta 59,297,512 (53,745,737) bushels. For the fifty-two weeks ending July 29, 1938 and July 30, 1937, 125,401,172 and 165,596,453 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending July 29, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,594,408 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 3,000 bushels. The total is 1,597,408 bushels as compared with 1,062,587 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 534,821 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937, a decrease of 1,022,362 bushels.
