### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 17, 1937, increased 10,096,615 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 94,005,135 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 67,240,900 bushels compared with 57,144,285 bushels for the previous week and 161,256,035 bushels for the week ending September 18, 1936. The stocks of 67,240,900 bushels include 14,707,059 bushels of Durum wheat.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,874,314 bushels, a decrease of 115,000 bushels from the previous week when 1,989,314 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 355,000; New York 793,000; Albany 436,000 and Duluth 71,314 bushels. Decreases are shown at New York of 448,000 and Albany 109,000 bushels, while increases were noted at Buffalo of 223,000 and Erie Canal 219,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,290,832 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 6,030,433; Buffalo 7,576,000; Erie 1,604,000; New York 1,618,399; Albany 2,357,000 and Chicago 105,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 1,575,885 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending September 17, 1937 were 65,386,586 bushels compared with 55,154,971 bushels for the previous week and 141,965,203 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in the Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 20,750,000; Interior Terminals 3,476,621; Vancouver-New Westminster 3,144,016; Prince Rupert 910,994; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 18,767,750; Eastern Elevators Lake & Seaboard Ports 4,959,564 and 2,227,356 bushels respectively.

Increases over the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 4,000,000; Interior Public & Semi-Public 300,627; Head of the Lakes 3,402,679; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,696,949 bushels and Vancouver-New Westminster 61,964 bushels. Decreases were noted at Interior Private & Mill Elevators of 204,000 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 245,717 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 8,598,120 bushels for the week ending September 17, 1937, compared with 12,835,107 bushels for the same period last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 2,102,356 bushels against 5,844,084 bushels last year.

#### PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the wock ending September 17, 1937 amounted to 10,786,013 bushels, an increase of 310,351 bushels whon 10,475,662 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 15,542,786 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending September 17, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 3,186,093 (1,818,457); Saskatchewan 2,114,081 (9,452,166); Alborta 5,485,839 (4,272,163) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the seven weeks from August 1 to September 17 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 23,135,038 (14,996,414); Saskatchewan 10,382,872 (52,091,114); Alberta 13,456,613 (17,622,527) bushels. For the seven weeks ending September 17, 1937 and September 18, 1936, 46,974,523 and 84,710,055 bushels were received from the farms.

#### OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending September 17, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,009,569 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 129,000 bushels. The total is 2,138,569 bushels as compared with 1,304,695 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 833,874 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 2,509,609 bushels.

The accumulated totals of imports of wheat into the United States for consumption and milling in bond are adjusted at the end of the month, due to the fact that the United States Department of Domestic and Foreign Commerce revises its weekly figures on a monthly basis.

#### CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPT. 17, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Sept. 17, 1937 show an increase of 13,164,330 bushels compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 67,240,900, oats 4,360,473, barley 12,094,397, flaxseed 437,088 and rye 1,247,784 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 10,096,615, oats 889,554, barley 2,023,199, flaxseed 35,060 and rye 119,902 bushels. Grain stocks at a comparable date last year were as follows:- wheat 161,256,035, oats 14,233,363, barley 14,339,676, flaxseed 663,663 and rye 3,156,756 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Grain in store shows an increase of 4,783,000 bushels composed of wheat 4,000,000, cats 401,000, barley 360,000, flaxseed 14,000 and rye 8,000 bushels.






