WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 24, 1937 increased 7,263,269 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 87,329,784 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 74,504,169 bushels compared with 67,240,900 bushels for the previous week and 161,833,953 bushels for the week ending September 25, 1936. The stocks of 74,504,169 bushels include 16,727,747 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,329,314 bushels, an increase of 455,000 bushels from the previous week when 1,874,314 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Buffalo 633,000; New York 644,000; Albany 342,000; Erie Canal 639,000 and Duluth 71,314 bushels. Increases are shown at Buffalo to 278,000 and Erie Canal 420,000 bushels while decreases were noted at New York of 149,000 and Albany 94,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,007,458 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 6,163,203; Buffalo 7,680,000; Erie 1,604,000; New York 1,307,255; Albany 2,158,000 and Chicago 95,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 1,602,957 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending September 24, 1937 were 72,174,855 bushels compared with 65,386,586 bushels for the previous week and 142,826,495 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in the Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 23,900,000; Interior Terminals 3,869,112; Vancouver-New Westminster 3,186,702; Prince Rupert 911,340; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 19,965,620; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 4,414,497 and 2,936,590 bushels respectively.

Increases over the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 3,150,000; Interior Terminals 392,491; Vancouver-New Westminster 42,686; Prince Rupert 346; Head of the Lakes 1,197,870 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 708,934 bushels. Decreases were noted at Eastern Elevators Lake Ports of 545,067 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 8,484,576 bushels for the week ending September 24, 1937, compared with 12,347,652 bushels for the same period last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 3,396,574 bushels against 4,412,793 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 24 amounted to 12,058,677 bushels, an increase of 1,272,664 bushels over the previous week when 10,786,013 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 9,168,632 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending September 24, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 3,291,030 (571,733); Saskatchewan 1,986,036 (4,871,867); Alberta 6,781,611 (3,725,032) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the eight weeks from August 1, 1937 to September 24, 1937 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 26,426,068 (15,568,147); Saskatchewan 12,368,908 (56,962,981); Alberta 20,238,224 (21,347,559) bushels. For the eight weeks ending September 24, 1937 and September 25, 1936, 59,033,200 and 93,878,687 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending September 24, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,280,165 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 77,000 bushels. The total is 1,357,165 bushels as compared with 2,138,569 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 781,404 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 3,483,564 bushels.

The accumulated totals of imports of wheat into the United States for consumption and milling in bond are adjusted at the end of the month, due to the fact that the United States Department of Domestic and Foreign Commerce revises their weekly figures on a monthly basis.

World shipments for the week ending September 25, 1937 amounted to 8,813,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 7,375,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,888,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from North America and Australia were higher than in the previous week showing increases of 158,000 and 554,000 bushels respectively, while shipments from Argentina showed a decrease of 154,000 bushels.

During the first eight weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 59.5 million bushels as compared with 84.6 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 22.1 million bushels this year as compared with 45.4 million bushels in 1936. Russian shipments amounted to 5.9 million bushels while last year for the same period they were nil.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first eight weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1936:-

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 7.4 million bushels per week compared with 10.6 million bushels for the same period last year. North American weekly average shipments amounted to only 2.8 million bushels per week as compared with 5.7 million bushels per week for the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 24, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Sept. 24, 1937 show an increase of 9,111,783 bushels, compared with the previous week. Grain stocks were as follows:- wheat 74,504,169, oats 5,158,802, barley 13,005,324, flaxseed 532,103 and rye 1,292,027 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 7,263,269, oats 798,329, barley 910,927, flaxseed 95,015 and rye 44,243 bushels. At a comparable date last year grain in store was as follows:- wheat 161,833,953, oats 15,256,002, barley 15,119,446, flaxseed 886,987 and rye 3,249,334 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show an increase of 4,087,000 bushels composed of wheat 3,150,000, oats 614,000, barley 255,000, flaxseed 48,000 and rye 20,000 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 79,988 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 42,686, oats 39,399 and rye 238 bushels while barley decreased 2,335 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat in store increased 346 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat in store remains unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show an increase of 1,543,117 bushels composed of wheat 1,197,870, oats 15,349, barley 267,551, flaxseed 6,494 and rye 55,853 bushels.
