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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 1, 1937, increased 305,492 bushels compared with the previous week and decreased 87,309,632 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1936. The amount in store was reported as 74,809,661 bushels compared with 74,504,169 bushels for the previous week and 162,119,293 bushels for the week ending October 2, 1936. The stocks of 74,809,661 bushels include 17,886,562 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,086,314 bushels, a decrease of 243,000 bushels from the previous week when 2,329,314 bushels were reported. Canadian wheat is located at the following ports: Duluth 71,314; Buffalo 494,000; Erie Canal 640,000; New York 539,000 and Albany 342,000 bushels. Decreases are shown at Buffalo 139,000 and New York 105,000 bushels while an increase of 1,000 bushels is noted at Erie Canal.

For the same week a year ago, Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,009,952 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 6,243,212; Buffalo 7,729,000; Erie 1,437,000; New York 1,360,740; Albany 2,158,000 and Chicago 82,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada amounted to 1,743,704 bushels for the above week. Last year for the same week, no United States wheat in Canada was reported.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending October 1, 1937, were 72,723,347 bushels, compared with 72,174,855 bushels for the previous week and 143,109,431 bushels for the corresponding date last year.

Stocks of wheat in the Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 23,075,000; Interior Terminals 4,423,478; Vancouver-New Westminster 3,056,384; Prince Rupert 911,340; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 21,396,166; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 6,987,372 and 2,545,531 bushels respectively.

Increases over the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Interior Terminals 554,366; Head of the Lakes 1,430,546 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 2,572,875 bushels. Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators 825,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 130,318; and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 391,059 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 7,471,143 bushels for the week ending October 1, 1937, compared with 10,354,693 bushels for the same period last year. The In Transit on the Lakes amounted to 2,066,424 bushels against 5,582,360 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 1, 1937 amounted to 6,544,558 bushels, a decrease of 5,514,119 bushels from the previous week when 12,058,677 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 6,818,243 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending October 1, 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 1,599,869 (444,798); Saskatchewan 1,360,901 (3,865,699); Alberta 3,583,788 (2,507,746) bushels. Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the nine weeks from August 1, 1937 to October 1, 1937 as compared with the same period in 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1936: Manitoba 28,025,937 (16,012,945); Saskatchewan 13,729,809 (60,828,680); Alberta 23,822,012 (23,855,305) bushels. For the nine weeks ending October 1, 1937 and October 2, 1936, 65,577,758 and 100,696,930 bushels were received from the farms.





OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending October 1, 1937, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,774,278 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 75,000 bushels. The total is 2,849,278 bushels as compared with 1,357,165 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 1,492,113 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1936, a decrease of 12,377,755 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending October 2, 1937 amounted to 9,206,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 8,813,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,512,000 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Shipments from North America and Argentina were higher than in the previous week showing increases of 257,000 and 740,000 bushels respectively, while shipments from Australia showed a decrease of 468,000 bushels.

During the first nine weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 68.5 million bushels as compared with 96.1 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 25.5 million bushels this year as compared with 50.8 million bushels in 1936. Australian shipments are only 9.7 million bushels this year as compared with 13.0 for the same period last year. Russian shipments amounted to 7.6 million bushels while last year for the same period they were nil.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 7.6 million bushels per week compared with 10.7 million bushels for the same period last year. North American weekly average shipments amounted to only 2.8 million bushels per week as compared with 5.6 million bushels per week for the same period last year.





CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 1, 1937

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Oct. 1, 1937 show a net increase of 977,163 bushels, compared with the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 74,809,661, oats 5,767,791, barley 12,993,568, flaxseed 590,105 and rye 1,308,463 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 305,492, oats 608,989, flaxseed 58,002 and rye 16,436 bushels, while barley decreased 11,756 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks of grain were as follows:- wheat 162,119,293, oats 15,718,531, barley 15,388,303, flaxseed 945,948 and rye 3,035,357 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 260,000 bushels. Wheat decreased 825,000 bushels while increases were shown in oats of 460,000, barley 80,000 and flaxseed 25,000 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Wheat stocks show an increase of 194,366 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 96,345 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 130,318 and barley 431 bushels while oats increased 34,404 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows an increase of 1,896,847 bushels composed of wheat 1,430,546, oats 116,592, barley 296,466, flaxseed 4,695 and rye 48,548 bushels.

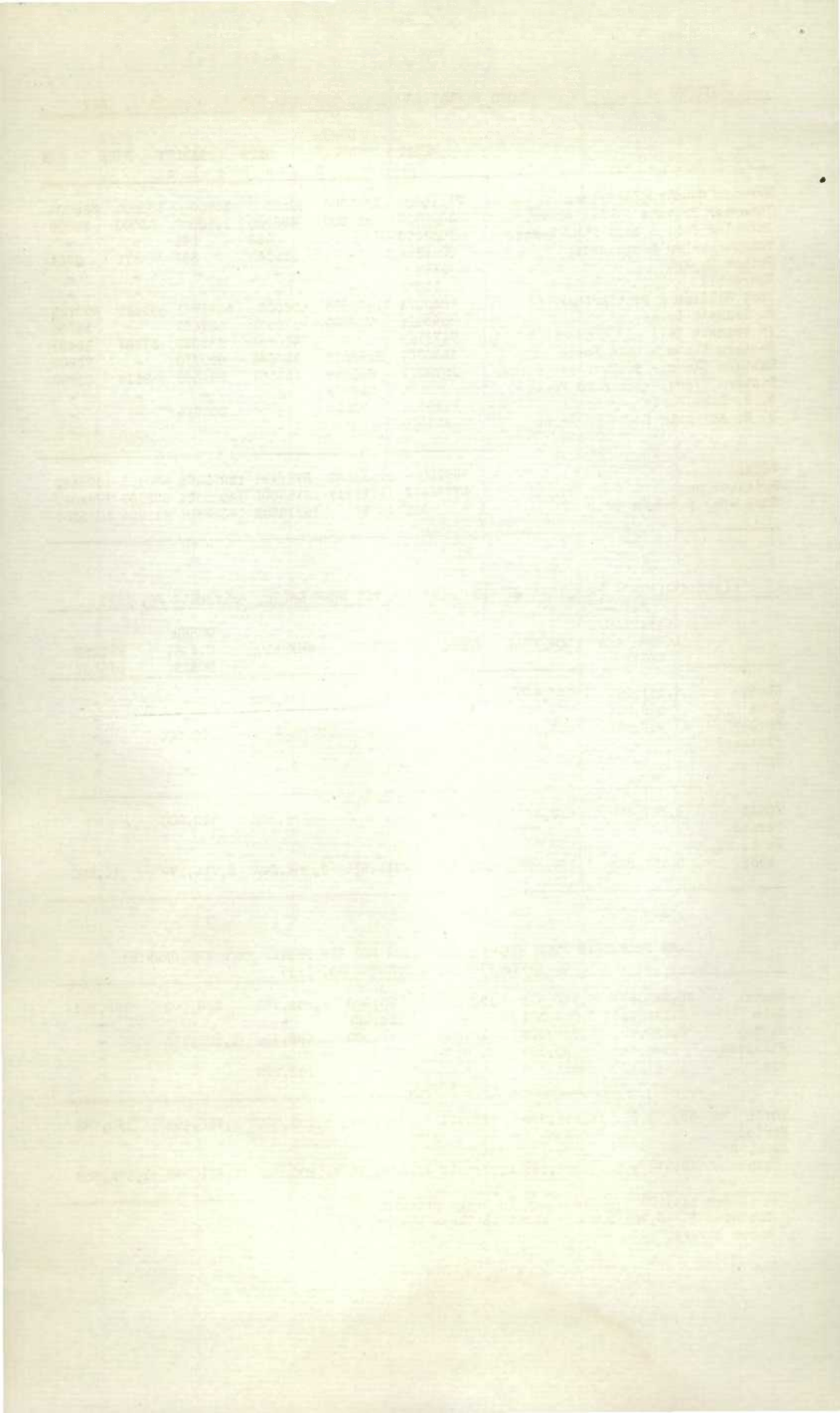
