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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 7, 1938 increased 11,941,137 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 91,272,697 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 165,412,104 bushels compared with 153,470,967 bushels for the previous week and 74,139,407 bushels for the week ending October 8, 1937. The stocks of 165,412,104 bushels include 16,368,108 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 3,298,000 bushels, an increase of 462,000 bushels over the previous week when 2,836,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 1,755,000; Buffalo Afloat 95,000; Erie 240,000; Erie Canal 558,000; New York 296,000; New York Afloat 14,000 and Albany 340,000 bushels. Increases over the stocks of the previous week were shown at the elevators located at: Buffalo 974,000; Erie 1,000; New York 115,000; and Albany 221,000 bushels, while decreases were noted in stocks afloat at Buffalo amounting to 596,000 bushels, on the Erie Canal 237,000 bushels and afloat at New York 16,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,878,000 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 9,902; Buffalo 424,000; Buffalo Afloat 457,000; Erie Canal 41,000; New York 365,000; New York Afloat 249,000 and Albany 342,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada totalled 1,437,333 bushels compared with 1,596,539 bushels for the previous year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending October 7, 1938 were 162,114,104 bushels compared with 150,634,967 bushels for the previous week and 72,251,505 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 69,758,000; Interior Terminals 7,914,905; Vancouver-New Westminster 14,709,860; Churchill 372,542; Fort William and Port Arthur 27,126,782; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 6,418,823 and 6,399,556 bushels respectively.

Increases were shown in the stocks over those of the previous week at all the elevators with the exception of the elevator at Churchill which decreased 609,492 bushels. The increases were as follows: Western Country Elevators 3,030,000; Interior Elevators 2,651,791; Vancouver-New Westminster 3,391,953; Head of the Lakes 2,602,905; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 1,433,877 and 1,959,502 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 21,290,898 bushels and the amount in lake transit was 8,122,738 bushels for the week ending October 7, 1938 compared with 7,800,418 and 4,759,033 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 7, 1938 amounted to 20,936,573 bushels a decrease of 7,762,044 bushels over the previous week when 28,698,617 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 3,783,667 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending October 7, 1938 were as follows, figures within the brackets being those for 1937; Manitoba 623,055 (609,026); Saskatchewan 8,764,462 (1,107,667); Alberta 11,549,056 (2,066,974) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the ten weeks from August 1, 1938 to October 7, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows: figures within brackets being those for 1937; Manitoba 36,730,912 (28,634,963); Saskatchewan 71,307,053 (14,837,476) Alberta 70,950,855 (25,888,986); bushels. For the ten weeks ending October 7, 1938 and the same period in 1937 178,988,820 and 69,361,425 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

SECTION I

The first section of the report deals with the general situation of the country in 1957. It points out that the economy has shown a marked improvement over the previous year, with a steady increase in production and a corresponding rise in the standard of living. The government has taken effective measures to stabilize the currency and to attract foreign investment, which has helped to diversify the economy and to reduce its dependence on a few primary products.

SECTION II

The second section of the report deals with the financial situation of the country. It shows that the government has managed to maintain a balanced budget throughout the year, despite the increase in public expenditure. This has been achieved through a combination of measures, including the introduction of new taxes and the rationalization of government services. The report also notes that the foreign exchange reserves have increased significantly, which is a positive sign for the country's economic stability.

The third section of the report deals with the social and cultural aspects of the country's development. It highlights the progress made in the fields of education, health, and social welfare. The government has invested heavily in these areas, and the results have been encouraging. The literacy rate has risen, and the life expectancy at birth has increased, reflecting the overall improvement in the country's social conditions.

The fourth section of the report deals with the international relations of the country. It notes that the country has maintained a policy of peaceful coexistence and has established friendly relations with a wide range of nations. This has helped to create a favorable international environment for the country's economic development.

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OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending October 7, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,585,452 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 255,000 bushels. The total is 4,840,452 bushels compared with 4,942,231 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 101,779 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937 an increase of 2,368,923 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending October 8, 1938 amounted to 10,754,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,895,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,584,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American, Argentine and Australian shipments showed decreases of 98,000, 685,000 and 270,000 bushels respectively, as compared with the previous week while Russian shipments showed an increase of 1,056,000 bushels.

During the first ten weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 108,705,000 bushels as compared with only 80,272,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 43,644,000 bushels as compared with 29,568,000 bushels for the same period in 1937. For the first ten weeks of the present crop year Australia shipped 18,314,000 bushels as compared with 10,592,000 bushels for the same weeks last year. Shipments from Russia amounted to 25,736,000 bushels as compared with only 10,144,000 for the same period last year.

North American weekly average shipments amounted to 4.4 million bushels as compared with 2.9 million bushels in the same weeks last year.




