WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 14, 1938 increased 6,028,459 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 98,174,795 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 171,440,563 bushels compared with 165,412,104 bushels for the previous week and 73,265,768 bushels for the week ending October 15, 1937. The stocks of 171,440,563 bushels include 16,318,954 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 3,361,000 bushels, an increase of 63,000 bushels over the previous week when 3,298,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 1,373,000; Erie 378,000; Erie Canal 669,000; New York 433,000; New York Afloat 111,000 and Albany 397,000 bushels. Increases over the stocks of the previous week were shown at the elevators located at Erie 138,000; Erie Afloat 111,000; New York 137,000; New York afloat 97,000 and Albany 57,000 bushels, while decreases were noted in stocks at Buffalo of 382,000 and Buffalo afloat of 95,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,755,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 827,000; Erie Canal 371,000; New York 547,000 and Albany 10,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada totalled 436,220 bushels compared with 1,585,567 bushels for the previous year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending October 14, 1938 were 168,079,563 bushels compared with 162,114,104 bushels for the previous week and 71,500,866 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 68,245,000; Interior Terminals 10,340,481; Vancouver-New Westminster 16,623,713; Churchill 377,539; Fort William and Port Arthur 29,617,177; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 6,378,171 and 9,036,620 bushels respectively.

Increases were shown in the stocks over those of the previous week at the following elevators Interior Terminal Elevators 2,425,576; Vancouver-New Westminster 1,918,853; Victoria 45,071; Churchill 5,047; Fort William and Port Arthur 2,490,395; and Eastern Elevators Seaboard ports 2,637,064 bushels, while decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 1,513,000 and Eastern Elevator Lake ports of 40,652 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 17,331,999 bushels and the amount in lake transit was 10,073,772 bushels for the week ending October 14, 1938 compared with 6,114,599 and 2,650,732 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 14, 1938 amounted to 13,450,417 bushels a decrease of 7,486,156 bushels over the previous week when 20,936,573 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 3,339,873 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending October 14, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 801,551 (329,510); Saskatchewan 5,001,133 (829,135); Alberta 7,647,733 (2,181,178) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the eleven weeks from August 1, 1938 to October 14, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 37,532,463 (28,964,473); Saskatchewan 76,308,186 (15,666,661); Alberta 78,598,588 (28,070,164) bushels. For the eleven weeks ending October 14, 1938 and the same period in 1937, 192,439,237 and 72,701,298 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending October 14, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,984,384 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 383,000 bushels. The total is 3,367,384 bushels compared with 4,840,452 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 1,473,068 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937 an increase of 998,461 bushels.
