#### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 4, 1938 increased 1,741,832 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 105,784,487 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 180,183,612 bushels compared with 178,441,780 bushels for the previous week and 74,399,125 bushels for the week ending November 6, 1937. The stocks of 180,183,612 bushels include 15,294,087 bushels of Durum wheat.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending November 4, 1938 were 175,169,612 bushels compared with 178,541,780 bushels for the previous week and 71,911,223 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 65,469,000; Interior Terminals 12,556,231; Vancouver-New Westminster 16,823,203; Victoria 199,896; Churchill 393,864; Fort William and Port Arthur 41,162,654; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 11,061,074 and 9,993,241 bushels respectively.

Increases were shown in the stocks over those of the previous week at the following elevators: Interior Terminal Elevators 905,160; Victoria 66,826; Churchill 15,329; Head of the Lakes 5,485,045; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 879,222 and 1,135,955 bushels respectively. Decreases were indicated at the Western Country Elevators of 1,289,000 and Vancouver-New Westminster 188,590 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 11,451,891 bushels and the amount in lake transit was 5,803,830 bushels for the week ending November 4, 1938 compared with 3,465,581 and 4,948,719 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,068,000 bushels, an increase of 168,000 bushels over the previous week when 4,900,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 564,000; Buffalo Afloat 948,000; Erie 1,509,000; Erie Canal 312,000; New York 574,000; New York Afloat 58,000 Philadelphia 10,000 and Albany 1,093,000 bushels. Increases over those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Buffalo Afloat 521,000; Erie 232,000; Albany 163,000 and Philadelphia 10,000 bushels while decreases were noted in the stocks at Buffalo of 356,000; Erie Canal 375,000; New York 14,000 and New York Afloat 13,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,487,902 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 9,902; Buffalo 1,231,000; Buffalo Afloat 394,000; Erie Canal 271,000; New York 532,000; New York Afloat 50,000 bushels.

#### PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 4, 1938 amounted to 9,345,934 bushels, a decrease of 3,643,149 bushels from the previous week when 12,989,083 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 4,331,575 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending November 4, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 493,745 (747,113); Saskatchewan 3,638,522 (714,248); Alberta 5,213,667 (2,870,214) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the fourteen weeks from August 1, 1938 to November 4, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 39,282,761 (30,706,133); Saskatchewan 91,443,115 (18,222,093); Alberta 98,264,269 (36,885,218) bushels. For the fourteen weeks ending November 4, 1938 and the same period in 1937, 228,990,145 and 85,813,444 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

#### OVERSEA'S EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending November 4, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,280,360 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 280,000 bushels. The total is 4,560,160 bushels compared with6,663,261 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 2,103,101 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937 an increase of 2,227,161 bushels.



World shipments for the week ending November 5, 1938 amounted to 11,288,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 14,784,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,656,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments were lower this week amounting to 6,193,000 bushels showing a decrease from the previous week of 1,157,000 bushels. Argentine and Australian shipments also showed docreases of 473,000 and 1,290,000 bushels respectively as compared with last week and Russian shipments were 248,000 bushels lower.

During the first fourteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 157,664,000 bushels as compared with only 124,856,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 70,295,000 bushels as compared with 47,128,000 bushels for the same period in 1937. Shipments from Australia were 6 million bushels higher for the first fourteen weeks of the present crop year as compared with the same period last year. Russian shipments were 9.4 million bushels higher than for the corresponding weeks in 1937.

North American weekly average shipments amounted to 5.0 million bushels as compared with 3.4 million bushels in the same weeks last year.
