WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 11, 1938 decreased 439,122 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 106,674,358 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 179,744,490 bushels compared with 180,183,612 bushels for the previous week and 73,070,132 bushels for the week ending November 12, 1937. The stocks of 179,744,490 bushels include 14,999,726 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending November 11, 1938 were 174,323,490 bushels compared with 175,169,612 bushels for the previous week and 70,620,230 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 64,375,000; Interior Terminals 12,341,818; Vancouver-New Westminster 16,418,973; Victoria 323,933; Churchill 559,655; Fort William and Port Arthur 40,698,409 Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 12,033,672 and 10,632,054 bushels respectively.

Decreases were shown in the stocks from those of the previous week at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 1,094,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 404,230; Head of Lakes 464,245; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 972,598 and 638,813 bushels respectively. Increases were indicated at the Interior Elevators 214,413; Victoria 124,037 and Churchill 165,791 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 10,075,523 bushels and the amount in lake transit was 6,864,453 bushels for the week ending November 11, 1938 compared with 5,685,473 and 3,796,373 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,421,000 bushels, an increase of 353,000 bushels over the previous week when 5,068,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 623,000; Buffalo Afloat 613,000; Erie 1,758,000; Erie Canal 373,000; New York 662,000 New York Afloat 287,000 and Albany 1,105,000 bushels. Increases over those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Buffalo 59,000; Erie 249,000; Erie Canal 61,000; New York 88,000; New York Afloat 229,000 and Albany 12,000 bushels, while decreases were noted in the stocks at Buffalo Afloat of 335,000 and Philadelphia 10,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,449,902 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 9,902; Buffalo 1,583,000; Erie Canal 273,000 and New York 584,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 11, 1938 amounted to 4,918,374 bushels, a decrease of 4,427,560 bushels from the previous week when 9,345,934 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 2,694,077 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending November 11, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 430,033 (346,760); Saskatchewan 1,754,908 (491,088); Alberta 2,733,433 (1,856,229) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the fifteen weeks from August 1, 1938 to November 11, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 39,712,794 (31,052,893); Saskatchewan 93,198,023 (18,713,181); Alberta 100,997,702 (38,741,447) bushels. For the fifteen weeks ending November 11, 1938 and the same period in 1937, 233,908,519 and 88,507,521 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending November 11, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,047,091 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 197,000 bushels. The total is 4,244,091 bushels compared with 4,560,160 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 316,069 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937 an increase of 1,147,325 bushels.
