WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 18, 1938 decreased 2,965,378 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 107,055,738 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 176,879,112 bushels compared with 179,744,490 bushels for the previous week and 69,823,374 bushels for the week ending November 19, 1937. The stocks of 176,879,112 bushels include 14,910,032 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending November 18, 1938 were 170,831,112 bushels compared with 174,323,490 bushels for the previous week and 66,493,374 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stock of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 62,549,000; Interior Terminals 12,201,801; Vancouver-New Westminster 16,232,775; Victoria 535,483; Churchill 896,293; Fort William and Port Arthur 37,711,491; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 14,880,811 and 10,408,074 bushels respectively.

Decreases were shown in the stocks from those of the previous week at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 1,826,000; Interior Elevators 140,017; Vancouver-New Westminster 185,198; Head of the Lakes 2,386,980; and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 223,980 bushels. Increases were indicated at Victoria of 207,550; Churchill 336,538 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 2,847,139 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 9,174,767 bushels and the amount in lake transit was 6,811,333 bushels for the week ending November 18, 1938 compared with 5,044,437 and 3,117,024 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 648,000 bushels, an increase of 627,000 bushels over the previous week when 5,421,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 565,000; Buffalo Afloat 984,000; Erie 2,178,000; Erie Canal 318,000; New York 835,000; New York Afloat 180,000; and Albany 986,000 bushels. Increases over those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Buffalo Afloat 371,000; Erie 420,000 and New York 173,000 while decreases were noted in the elevators at Buffalo of 58,000; Erie Canal 55,000; New York Afloat 107,000 and Albany 117,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 3,331,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 1,966,000; Erie Canal 273,000; New York 774,000 and Albany 318,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 18, 1938 amounted to 4,952,195 bushels, an increase of 33,821 bushels over the previous week when 4,918,374 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,981,693 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending November 18, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 332,338 (275,494); Saskatchewan 1,843,541 (412,491); Alberta 2,776,316 (1,293,708) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the sixteen weeks from August 1, 1938 to November 18, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 40,045,132 (31,328,387); Saskatchewan 95,041,564 (19,125,672); Alberta 103,774,018 (40,035,155) bushels. For the sixteen weeks ending November 18, 1938 and the same period in 1937, 238,860,714 and 90,489,214 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending November 18, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 5,292,932 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 154,000 bushels. The total is 5,446,932 bushels compared with 4,244,091 bushels for the previous week an increase of 1,202,841 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1937 an increase of 2,922,833 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending November 19, 1938 amounted to 11,967,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 11,463,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,336,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments were slightly lower this week amounting to 6,355,000 bushels as compared with 6,482,000 bushels for the previous week. Argentine and Australian shipments also showed decreases of 187,000 and 6,000 bushels respectively as compared with last week and Russian shipments were 728 bushels lower.

During the first sixteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 181,270,000 bushels as compared with only 148,336,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 83,141,000 bushels as compared with 57,856,000 bushels for the same period in 1937. Shipments from Argentina were 4.5 million bushels higher for the first sixteen weeks of the present crop year as compared with the same period last year. Russian shipments were 6.7 million bushels higher than for the corresponding weeks in 1937.
