## WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 25, 1938 decreased 3,918,757 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 105,861,777 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 172,960,355 bushels compared with 176,879,112 bushels for the previous week and 67,098,578 bushels for the week ending November 26, 1937. The stocks of 172,960,355 bushels include 14,239,937 bushels of Durum wheat.

## CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending November 25, 1938 were 167,096,355 bushels compared with 170,831,112 bushels for the previous week and 62,638,578 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 60,621,000; Interior Terminals 12,094,529; Vancouver-New Westminster 16,146,325; Victoria 617,300; Churchill 1,455,670; Fort William and Port Arthur 35,212,239; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 16,661,123 and 9,669,970 bushels respectively.

Decreases were shown in the stocks from those of the previous week at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 1,928,000; Interior Private and Mill 136,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 86,450; Fort William and Port Arthur 2,499,252 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 738,104 bushels. Increases were indicated at Interior Public and Semi-public of 28,728; Victoria 81,817; Churchill 559,377 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,780,312 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 8,701,108 bushels and the amount in lake transit was 4,267,150 bushels for the week ending November 25, 1938 compared with 5,785,754 and 2,027,369 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

### CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,864,000 bushels, a decrease of 184,000 bushels from the previous week when 6,048,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 687,000; Buffalo Afloat 949,000; Erie 2,178,000; Erie Canal 20,000; New York 929,000; New York Afloat 173,000 and Albany 928,000 bushels. Decreases from those of the previous week were shown at the following elevators: Buffalo Afloat 35,000; Erie Canal 298,000; New York Afloat 7,000 and Albany 60, 'O bushels while increases were noted in the elevators at Buffalo of 122,000 and New York 94,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 4,460,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 2,096,000; New York 2,001,000 and Albany 363,000 bushels.

## PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 25, 1938 amounted to 3,855,217 bushels, a decrease of 1,096,978 bushels from the previous week when 4,952,195 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,537,677 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending November 25, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 262,454 (202,467); Saskatchewan 1,557,745 (290,055); Alberta 2,035,018 (1,045,155) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the seventeen weeks from August 1, 1938 to November 25, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 40,307,586 (31,530,854); Saskatchewan 96,599,309 (19,415,727); Alberta 105,809,036 (41,080,310) bushels. For the seventeen weeks ending November 25, 1938 and the same period in 1937, 242,715,931 bushels and 92,026,891 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

## OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES.



During the week ending November 25, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 5,450,607 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 207,000 bushels. The total is 5,657,607 bushels compared with 5,446,932 bushels for the previous week an increase of 210,675 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1937 an increase of 2,672,807 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending November 26, 1938 amounted to 12,335,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 11,967,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,152,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments were slightly lower this week amounting to 6,322,000 bushels as compared with 6,355,000 bushels for the previous week. Argentine shipments also showed a decrease of 34,000 bushels as compared with last week while Australian shipments showed an increase of 984,000 bushels.


During the first seventeen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 193,590,000 bushels as compared with only 157,488,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 39,469,000 bushels as compared with 63,160,000 bushels for the same period in 1937. Shipments from Argentina were 5.1 million bushels higher for the first seventeen weeks of the present crop year as compared with the same period last year. Russian shipments were 5.4 million bushels higher than for the corresponding weeks in 1937.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 11.4 million bushels per week compared with 9.3 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1937. North American weekly average shipments amounted to 5.3 million bushels as compared with 3.7 million bushels in the same weeks last year.
