WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 9, 1938 decreased 272,799 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 109,464,625 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 170,927,818 bushels compared with 170,655,019 bushels for the previous week and 61,463,193 bushels for the week ending December 10, 1937. The stocks of 170,927,818 bushels include 13,794,221 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending December 9, 1938 were 162,326,818 bushels compared with 162,375,019 bushels for the previous week and 56,397,193 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 57,365,000; Interior Terminals 11,732,451; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,604,720; Victoria 682,644; Churchill 1,983,389; Fort William and Port Arthur 33,254,459; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 23,551,866 and 10,904,404 bushels respectively.

Increases were shown in the stocks over those of the previous week at the following elevators: Interior Elevators 9,961; Victoria 24,422; Churchill 71,789; Fort William and Port Arthur 2,229,237; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 4,087,937 and Seaboard Ports 126,995 bushels. Decreases were indicated at Western Country and Vancouver Elevators of 310,000 and 51,944 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 6,915,531 bushels and the amount in lake transit was 332,354 bushels for the week ending December 9, 1938 compared with 3,135,607 and 1,007,045 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 8,601,000 bushels, an increase of 321,000 bushels over the previous week when 8,280,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 777,000; Buffalo Afloat 3,763,000; Erie 2,151,000; New York 863,000; New York Afloat 147,000; Albany 851,000 and Philadelphia 49,000 bushels. Increases were noted in the elevator stocks at Buffalo of 230,000; Buffalo Afloat 162,000; Erie 13,000 and Philadelphia 49,000 bushels while decreases from those of the previous week were shown at New York of 42,000 and New York Afloat 91,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,066,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 922,000; Erie 1,116,000; New York 2,637,000; Albany 388,000 and Baltimore 3,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 9, 1938 amounted to 2,402,489 bushels, a decrease of 811,593 bushels from the previous week when 3,214,082 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,160,640 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending December 9, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 220,296 (145,128); Saskatchewan 1,074,060 (203,120); Alberta 1,108,133 (812,392) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the nineteen weeks from August 1, 1938 to December 9, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 40,700,814 (31,964,385); Saskatchewan 98,926,997 (19,852,924); Alberta 108,704,691 (43,025,472) bushels. For the nineteen weeks ending December 9, 1938 and the same period in 1937, 248,332,502 bushels and 94,842,781 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending December 9, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,389,223 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 119,000 bushels. The total is 1,508,223 bushels compared with 3,006,971 bushels for the previous week a decrease of 1,498,748 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1937 an increase of 251,481 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending December 10, 1938 amounted to 7,236,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 11,769,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,704,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Argentine shipments were lower this week by 2,606,000 and 657,000 bushels respectively, while Australian shipments showed an increase of 1,042,000 bushels.

During the first nineteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 212,645,000 bushels as compared with only 178,520,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 96,268,000 bushels as compared with 73,112,000 bushels for the same period in 1937. Shipments from Argentina were 5.8 million bushels higher for the first nineteen weeks of the present crop year as compared with the same period last year. Russian shipments were 4.0 million bushels higher than for the corresponding weeks in 1937.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 11.2 million bushels per week compared with 9.4 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1937. North American weekly average shipments amounted to 5.1 million bushels as compared with 3.9 million bushels in the same weeks last year.






