WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 16, 1938 decreased 259,948 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 110,319,352 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 170,668,870 bushels compared with 170,927,818 bushels for the previous week and 60,349,518 bushels for the week ending December 17, 1937. The stocks of 170,668,870 bushels include 13,851,473 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending December 16, 1938 were 162,166,870 bushels compared with 162,326,818 bushels for the previous week and 55,034,518 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 56,545,000; Interior Terminals 11,725,712; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,630,590; Victoria 696,798; Churchill 2,157,531; Fort William and Port Arthur 35,909,024; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 23,472,271 and 10,876,942 bushels respectively.

Increases were shown in the stocks over those of the previous week at the following elevators: Vancouver-New Westminster 25,370; Victoria 14,154; Churchill 173,142 and Fort William and Port Arthur 2,654,565 bushels, while decreases were noted at the Western Country Elevators of 20,000; Interior Elevators 6,739 and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 79,595 and 27,462 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 5,353,002 bushels compared with 3,641,601 bushels for the same week a year ago. There was no Lake Transit wheat this week but for the corresponding week a year ago, the In Transit Lake amounted to 202,010 bushels.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 8,502,000 bushels, a decrease of 99,000 bushels from the previous week when 8,601,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 744,000; Buffalo Afloat 3,647,000; Erie 2,052,000; New York 969,000; New York Afloat 147,000; Albany 851,000 and Philadelphia 92,000 bushels. Increases were noted in the elevator stocks at Erie of 99,000; New York 106,000 and Philadelphia 43,000 bushels while decreases were noted at Buffalo of 33,000 and Buffalo Afloat 116,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,315,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 390,000; Buffalo Afloat 209,000; Erie 1,116,000; New York 3,015,000; Albany 276,000; New York Afloat 116,000 and Philadelphia 193,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 16, 1938 amounted to 2,860,832 bushels, an increase of 458,343 bushels over the previous week when 2,402,489 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,329,218 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending December 16, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 113,895 (167,358); Saskatchewan 912,465 (223,225); Alberta 1,834,472 (938,635); bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty weeks from August 1, 1938 to December 16, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 40,814,709 (32,131,743); Saskatchewan 99,839,462 (20,076,149); Alberta 110,539,163 (43,964,107) bushels. For the twenty weeks ending December 16, 1938 and the same period in 1937, 251,193,334 bushels and 96,171,999 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending December 16, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 753,707 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 98,000 bushels. The total is 851,707 bushels compared with 1,508,223 bushels for the previous week a decrease of 656,516 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1937 a decrease of 1,083,294 bushels.
