WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 30, 1938 decreased 185,716 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 111,708,932 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 169,086,599 bushels compared with 169,272,315 bushels for the previous week and 57,377,667 bushels for the week ending December 31, 1937. The stocks of 169,086,599 bushels include 13,617,547 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending December 30, 1938 were 161,160,599 bushels compared with 161,135,315 bushels for the previous week and 52,673,667 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 55,220,000; Interior Terminals 12,971,590; Vancouver-New Westminster 14,361,160; Victoria 699,692; Churchill 2,213,300; Fort William and Port Arthur 38,263,801; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 22,553,352 and 10,821,329 bushels respectively.

Decreases were shown in the stocks from those of the previous week at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 290,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 557,474; Victoria 30,492 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 376,837 bushels. Increases were noted at the Interior Elevators of 644,043; Churchill 4,406; Fort William and Port Arthur 693,890 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 28,257 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 693,890 bushels compared with 3,448,074 bushels for the same week a year ago.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 7,926,000 bushels, a decrease of 211,000 bushels from the previous week when 8,137,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 780,000; Buffalo Afloat 3,441,000; Erie 1,826,000; New York 761,000; New York Afloat 110,000; Albany 851,000 and Philadelphia 157,000 bushels. Decreases were shown in the stocks from those of the previous week at Buffalo of 92,000; Erie 123,000; New York 40,000 and New York Afloat 37,000 bushels while increases were noted at Buffalo Afloat of 16,000 and Philadelphia 65,000 bushels. Wheat stocks at Albany remain the same as for the previous week.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 4,704,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 330,000; Erie 1,077,000; New York 2,901,000; New York Afloat 116,000; Albany 276,000 and Philadelphia 4,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 30, 1938 amounted to 1,303,730 bushels, a decrease of 754,719 bushels from the previous week when 2,058,449 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 608,963 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending December 30, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 105,102 (49,791); Saskatchewan 542,752 (174,901); Alberta 648,876 (384,271) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-two weeks from August 1, 1938 to December 30, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 41,068,308 (32,328,445); Saskatchewan 101,199,446 (20,614,172); Alberta 112,287,759 (45,332,629) bushels. For the twenty-two weeks ending December 30, 1938 and the same period in 1937, 254,555,513 bushels and 98,275,246 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending December 30, 1938 the Overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,290,400 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 109,000 bushels. The total is 1,399,400 bushels compared with 2,015,300 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 615,900 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1937 a decrease of 104,018 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending December 31, 1938 amounted to 10,109,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,234,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,448,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North America showed a decrease this week of 935,000 bushels while Australian and Argentine shipments were higher by 264,000 and 890,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week.

During the first twenty-two weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 239,247,000 bushels as compared with only 206,216,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 104,791,000 bushels as compared with 85,136,000 bushels for the same period in 1937. Shipments from Argentina were 4.9 million bushels higher for the first twenty-two weeks of the present crop year as compared with the same period last year. Russian shipments were 3.8 million bushels higher than for the corresponding weeks in 1937.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 10.9 million bushels per week compared with 9.4 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1937. North American weekly average shipments amounted to 4.8 million bushels as compared with 3.9 million bushels in the same weeks last year.
