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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 13, 1939 decreased 1,633,808 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 108,537,636 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 164,355,074 bushels, compared with 165,988,882 bushels for the previous week and 55,817,438 bushels for the week ending January 14, 1938. The stocks of 150,994,898 bushels include 13,360,176 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending January 13, 1939 were 157,037,074 bushels compared with 158,462,882 bushels for the previous week and 51,447,438 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 53,543,000; Interior Terminals 13,398,781; Vancouver-New Westminster 12,945,591; Victoria 754,649; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 38,661,736; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 20,775,099 and 10,651,049 bushels respectively.

Decreases were noted at the Western Country elevators of 1,102,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 400,234; and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard ports 1,056,237 and 29,635 bushels respectively. Increases were indicated at Interior Elevators of 337,507; Victoria 19,169 and Fort William and Port Arthur 70,945 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 4,093,789 bushels compared with 2,796,385 bushels for the same week a year ago.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 7,318,000 bushels, a decrease of 208,000 bushels from the previous week when 7,526,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 656,000; Buffalo Afloat 3,441,000; Erie 1,624,000; New York 521,900; New York Afloat 44,000; Albany 851,000; Philadelphia 165,000 bushels and Baltimore 16,000 bushels. Decreases were shown at Buffalo of 51,000; Erie 81,000; New York 52,000; New York Afloat 48,000 bushels, while increases took place at Baltimore of 16,000 and Philadelphia 8,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 4,370,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 326,000; Erie 991,000; New York 2,775,000; Albany 276,000 and Philadelphia 2,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 13, 1939 amounted to 1,166,155 bushels, an increase of 527,417 bushels over the previous week when 638,738 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 2,132,273 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending January 13, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 77,109 (135,111); Saskatchewan 405,140 (519,606); Alberta 663,906 (1,477,556) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-four weeks from August 1, 1938 to January 13, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 41,200,633 (32,606,479); Saskatchewan 101,837,825 (21,358,560); Alberta 113,321,948 (47,328,833) bushels. For the twenty-four weeks ending January 13, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 256,360,406 bushels and 101,293,872 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

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OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending January 13, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,051,252 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 176,000 bushels. The total is 2,227,252 bushels compared with 2,056,141 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 171,111 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 1,067,690 bushels.






