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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 3, 1939 decreased 3,347,460 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 104,411,217 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 156,621,798 bushels, compared with 159,969,258 bushels for the previous week and 52,210,581 bushels for the week ending February 4, 1938. The stocks of 156,621,798 bushels include 13,003,524 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending February 3, 1939 were 150,375,798 bushels compared with 153,324,258 bushels for the previous week and 49,327,581 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 49,600,000; Interior Terminals 16,320,729; Vancouver-New Westminster 10,290,466; Victoria 799,362; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 39,937,578; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 18,272,270 and 10,363,536 bushels respectively.

Decreases were noted at the Western Country Elevators of 817,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 1,228,917; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 865,016 and 252,942 bushels respectively. Increases were indicated at Interior Elevators of 822,167; Victoria 44,014 and Fort William and Port Arthur 317,725 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,578,477 bushels compared with 2,189,518 bushels for the same week a year ago.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 6,246,000 bushels, a decrease of 399,000 bushels from the previous week when 6,645,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 467,000; Buffalo Afloat 2,945,000; Erie 1,066,000; New York 637,000; New York Afloat 18,000; Albany 851,000; Philadelphia 112,000; Boston 134,000 and Baltimore 16,000 bushels. Decreases were shown at Buffalo of 15,000; Buffalo Afloat 213,000; Erie 217,000 and Baltimore 56,000 bushels, while increases were noted at New York of 72,000; Philadelphia 4,000 and Boston 26,000 bushels. Stocks at Albany and New York Afloat remain unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,883,000 bushels distributed as follows; Buffalo 155,000; Erie 731,000; New York 1,658,000; New York Afloat 63,000 and Albany 276,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 3, 1939 amounted to 998,272 bushels, a decrease of 211,665 bushels from the previous week when 1,209,937 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 572,589 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending February 3, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938; Manitoba 87,429 (92,500); Saskatchewan 329,499 (131,655); Alberta 581,344 (348,434) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-seven weeks from August 1, 1938 to February 3, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 40,601,476 (33,097,054); Saskatchewan 103,556,887 (22,120,554); Alberta 115,384,258 (49,216,609) bushels. For the twenty-seven weeks ending February 3, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 259,542,621 and 104,434,217 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

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OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending February 3, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,690,034 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 228,000 bushels. The total is 2,918,034 bushels compared with 1,823,337 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 1,094,697 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 1,721,375 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending February 4, 1939 amounted to 13,741,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,619,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,992,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Argentine shipments showed increases of 83,000 and 1,661,000 bushels respectively while Australia showed a decrease of 806,000 bushels as compared with the previous week.

During the first twenty-seven weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 295,624,000 bushels as compared with only 256,624,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 129,975,000 bushels as compared with 103,976,000 bushels for the same period in 1937-38. Shipments from Argentina were 4.9 million bushels higher for the first twenty-seven weeks of the present crop year as compared with the same period last year.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour in the first twenty-seven weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1937-38.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 10.9 million bushels per week compared with 9.5 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1937-38. North American weekly average shipments amounted to 4.8 million bushels as compared with 3.9 million bushels in the same weeks last year.
