WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 10, 1939 decreased 2,448,568 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 103,490,684 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 154,173,230 bushels, compared with 156,621,798 bushels for the previous week and 50,682,546 bushels for the week ending February 11, 1938. The stocks of 154,173,230 bushels include 12,757,262 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending February 10, 1939 were 148,714,230 bushels compared with 150,375,798 bushels for the previous week and 48,041,546 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 49,045,000; Interior Terminals 16,776,958; Vancouver-New Westminster 10,209,768; Victoria 839,586; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 39,994,029; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 17,558,425 and 10,280,143 bushels respectively.

Decreases were noted at the Western Country Elevators of 515,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 80,698; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 713,845 and 83,393 bushels respectively. Increases were indicated at Interior Elevators of 456,229; Victoria 40,224 and Fort William and Port Arthur 56,451 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,796,941 bushels compared with 1,947,290 bushels for the same week a year ago.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 5,459,000 bushels, a decrease of 787,000 bushels from the previous week when 6,246,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 410,000; Buffalo Afloat 2,435,000; Erie 890,000; New York 480,000; New York Afloat 18,000; Albany 851,000; Philadelphia 126,000; Boston 162,000 and Baltimore 87,000 bushels. Decreases were shown at Buffalo of 57,000; Buffalo Afloat 510,000; Erie 176,000 and New York 157,000 bushels, while increases were noted at Philadelphia of 14,000; Boston 28,000 and Baltimore 71,000 bushels. Stocks at Albany and New York Afloat remain unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,641,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 140,000; Erie 731,000; New York 1,464,000; New York Afloat 30,000 and Albany 276,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 10, 1939 amounted to 656,698 bushels, a decrease of 405,367 bushels from the previous week when 1,062,065 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 628,280 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending February 10, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 53,293 (152,525); Saskatchewan 247,459 (92,649); Alberta 355,946 (383,106) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-eight weeks from August 1, 1938 to February 10, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 40,667,384 (33,249,579); Saskatchewan 103,813,897 (22,213,203); Alberta 115,827,382 (49,599,715) bushels. For the twenty-eight weeks ending February 10, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 260,308,663 and 105,062,497 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending February 10, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,298,078 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 212,000 bushels. The total is 1,510,078 bushels compared with 2,918,034 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 1,397,956 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 a decrease of 250,546 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending February 11, 1939 amounted to 13,046,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 13,741,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,904,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Argentine shipments showed decreases of 1,173,000 and 1,620,000 bushels respectively while Australia showed an increase of 1,626,000 bushels as compared with the previous week.

During the first twenty-eight weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 308,603,000 bushels as compared with only 267,528,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 134,381,000 bushels as compared with 107,840,000 bushels for the same period in 1937-38. Shipments from Argentina were 4.8 million bushels higher for the first twenty-eight weeks of the present crop year as compared with the same period last year.

North American weekly average shipments amounted to 4.8 million bushels as compared with 3.9 million bushels in the same weeks last year.

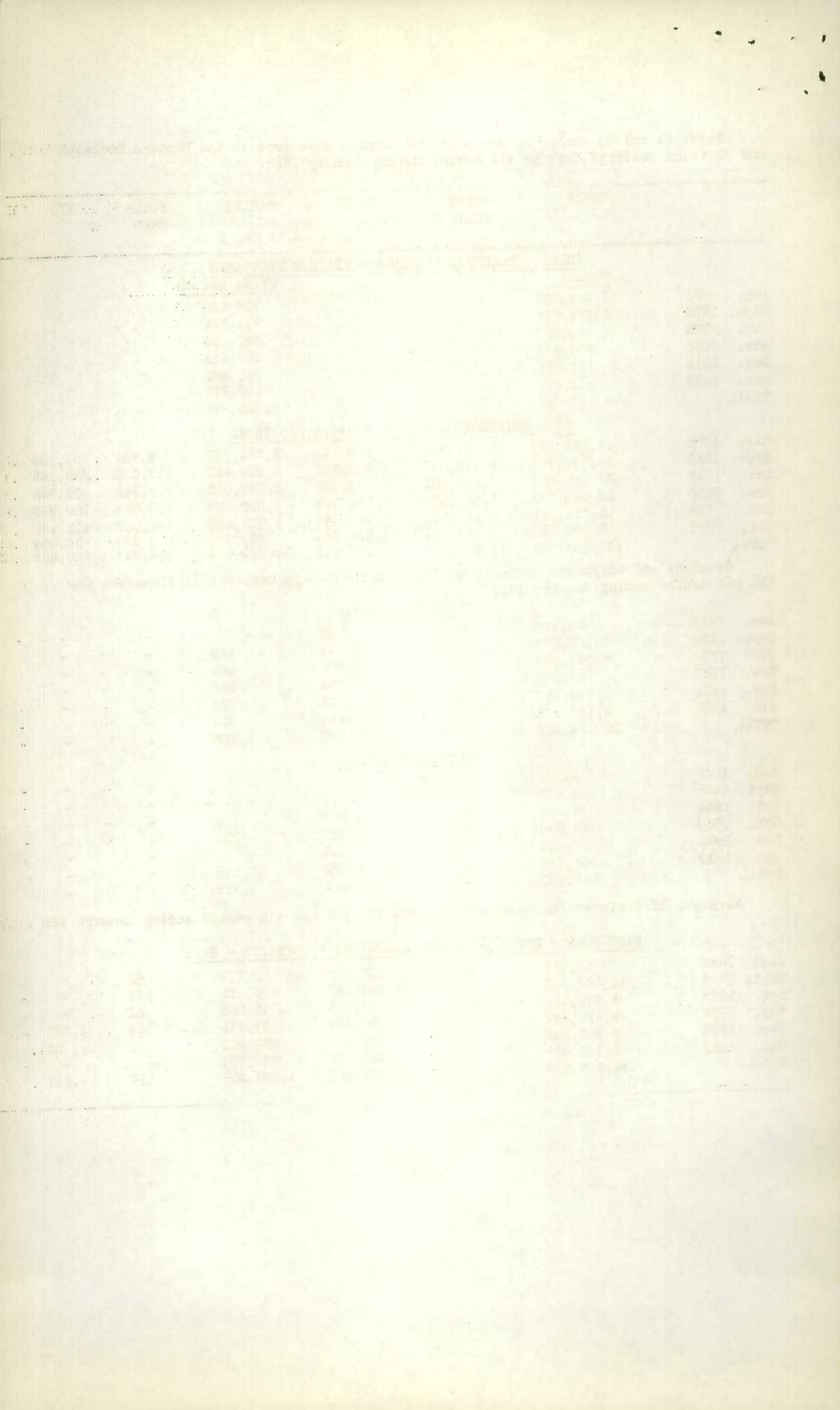
