WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 17, 1939 decreased 2,540,519 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 102,754,167 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 151,632,711 bushels compared with 154,173,230 bushels for the previous week and 48,878,544 bushels for the week ending February 18, 1938. The stocks of 151,632,711 bushels include 12,606,820 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending February 17, 1939 were 146,938,711 bushels compared with 148,714,230 bushels for the previous week and 46,760,544 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators, 48,460,000; Interior Terminals 16,766,386; Vancouver-New Westminster 9,763,062; Victoria 852,152; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 40,945,376; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 16,979,811 and 9,953,980 bushels respectively.

Decreases were noted at the Western Country Elevators of 585,000; Interior Elevators 10,572; Vancouver-New Westminster, 446,706; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 578,614 and 326,163 bushels respectively. Increases were indicated at Victoria of 12,566 and Fort William and Port Arthur of 51,347 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 1,904,564 bushels compared with 1,259,390 bushels for the same week a year ago.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES


Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 4,694,000 bushels, a decrease of 765,000 bushels from the previous week when 5,459,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 382,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,945,000; Erie 771,000; New York 371,000; New York Afloat 18,000; Albany 851,000; Philadelphia 92,000; Boston 208,000 and Baltimore 56,000 bushels. Decreases were shown at Buffalo of 28,000; Buffalo Afloat 490,000; Erie 119,000; New York 109,000; Philadelphia 34,000 and Baltimore 31,000 bushels, while Boston increased 46,000 bushels. Stocks at Albany and New York Afloat remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,118,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 46,000; Erie 731,000; New York 1,065,000 and Albany 276,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 17, 1939 amounted to 278,922 bushels, a decrease of 315,030 bushels from the previous week when 593,952 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 478,577 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending February 17, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 29,204 (117,445); Saskatchewan 121,398 (109,428); Alberta 128,320 (251,704) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-nine weeks from August 1, 1938 to February 17, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 40,710,237 (33,367,024); Saskatchewan, 103,839,863 (22,322,631); Alberta 115,974,739 (49,851,419) bushels. For the twenty-nine weeks ending February 17, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 260,524,839 and 105,541,074 bushels respectively were received from the farms.



OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending February 17, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,361,154 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 269,000 bushels. The total is 1,630,154 bushels compared with 1,510,078 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 120,076 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 638,609 bushels.
