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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 19, 1938 increased 5,697,326 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 7,437,368 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 23,331,663 bushels compared with 17,634,337 bushels for the previous week and 30,769,031 bushels for the week ending August 20, 1937. The stocks of 23,331,663 bushels include 7,903,848 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,238,000 bushels, a decrease of 471,000 bushels over the previous week when 767,000 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 169,000; Erie 590,000; New York 35,000; New York Afloat 435,000 and Albany 9,000 bushels. Decreases were noted at Buffalo of 48,000 and Albany 81,000 bushels, while increases were shown in the Erie Canal stocks of 247,000; New York 28,000; New York Afloat 325,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,737,020 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 136,020; Buffalo 236,000; New York 1,693,000 and Albany 672,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was 186,086 bushels compared with 578,398 bushels for the previous year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending August 19, 1938 were 22,093,663 bushels compared with 16,867,337 bushels for the previous week and 28,032,011 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators are located as follows: Western Country Elevators 5,407,000; Interior Terminals 1,289,935; Vancouver-New Westminster 73,060; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 4,429,630; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 1,926,403 and 3,234,022 bushels respectively.

Decreases were shown in the stocks from those of the previous week at the following elevators: Interior Elevators 77,111; Vancouver-New Westminster 3,131; Head of the Lakes 531,522 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 372,046 bushels, while increases were noted at the Western Country Elevators of 3,035,000 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 750,364 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 4,018,000 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 784,820 bushels for the week ending August 19, 1938 compared with 2,440,988 and 620,524 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 19, 1938 amounted to 5,053,406 bushels, an increase of 3,658,539 bushels over the previous week when 1,394,867 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 4,188,848 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending August 19, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 3,073,725 (2,461,409); Saskatchewan 1,210,203 (1,143,449); Alberta 769,478 (583,990) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the three weeks from August 1, 1938 to August 19, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 3,801,821 (2,800,402); Saskatchewan 1,620,304 (1,736,492); Alberta 1,398,258 (1,039,110) bushels. For the three weeks ending August 19, 1938 and the same period in 1937, 6,820,383 and 5,576,004 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending August 19, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,488,307 bushels and no imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were reported. This compared with 1,808,053 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 319,746 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937 a decrease of 501,872 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending August 20, 1938 amounted to 10,867,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,268,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,672,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase of 207,000 bushels as compared with the previous week, while Argentine and Australian shipments showed decreases of 435,000 and 5,000 bushels respectively.

During the first three weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 35,167,000 bushels as compared with only 21,256,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 12,885,000 bushels as compared with 9,144,000 bushels for the same period in 1937. For the first three weeks of the present crop year Russia shipped 8,920,000 bushels as compared with 272,000 bushels for the same weeks last year.
