

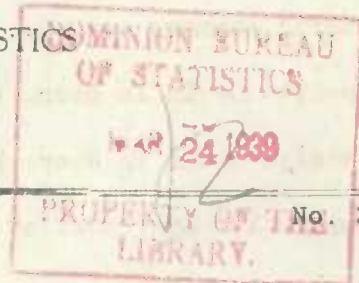

WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 17, 1939 decreased 2,350,573 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 96,745,468 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 142,747,668 bushels compared with 145,098,241 bushels for the previous week and 46,002,200 bushels for the week ending March 18, 1938. The stocks of 142,747,668 bushels include 12,317,766 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending March 17, 1939 were 139,646,668 bushels compared with 141,741,241 bushels for the previous week and 44,267,300 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 47,258,000; Interior Terminals 16,445,131; Vancouver-New Westminster 6,396,014; Victoria 568,185; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 40,515,841; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 14,261,492 and 9,272,798 bushels respectively.

Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 577,000; Interior Elevators 223,510; Vancouver-New Westminster 1,128,746; and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 740,209 and 220,222 bushels respectively. Increases were indicated at Victoria of 25,704 and Fort William and Port Arthur of 62,917 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,715,827 bushels compared with 1,331,082 bushels for the same week a year ago.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 3,101,000 bushels, a decrease of 256,000 bushels from the previous week when 3,357,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 252,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,209,000; Erie 451,000; New York 355,000; New York Afloat 18,000; Albany 771,000 Philadelphia 36,000 and Boston 9,000 bushels. Decreases in stocks were shown at the following ports: Buffalo 6,000; Erie 72,000; New York 33,000; Albany 80,000; Philadelphia 12,000; and Boston 53,000 bushels. Stocks at Buffalo Afloat and New York Afloat remained unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,734,900 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 25,000; Erie 695,000; New York 573,000; Albany 212,900 and Boston 229,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 17, 1939 amounted to 1,246,752 bushels, a decrease of 103,474 bushels from the previous week when 1,350,226 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,014,596 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending March 17, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 159,181 (269,749); Saskatchewan 505,986 (300,185); Alberta 581,585 (444,662) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-three weeks from August 1, 1938 to March 17, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 41,172,204 (34,443,613); Saskatchewan 105,548,070 (23,401,063); Alberta 118,284,726 (52,026,900) bushels. For the thirty-three weeks ending March 17, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 265,005,000 and 109,871,576 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending March 17, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,858,660 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 161,000 bushels. The total is 2,019,660 bushels compared with 1,560,370 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 459,290 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 1,287,434 bushels.

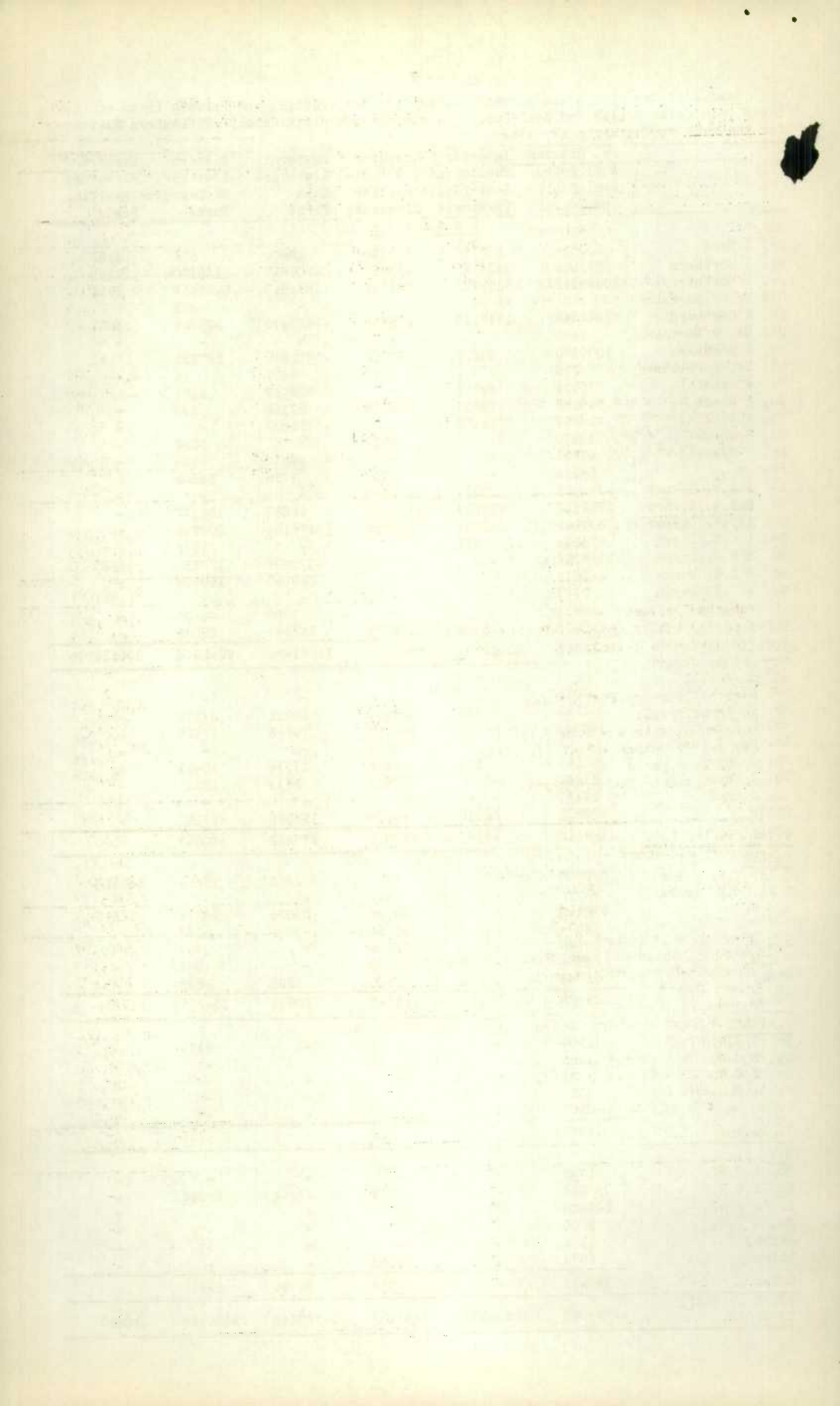

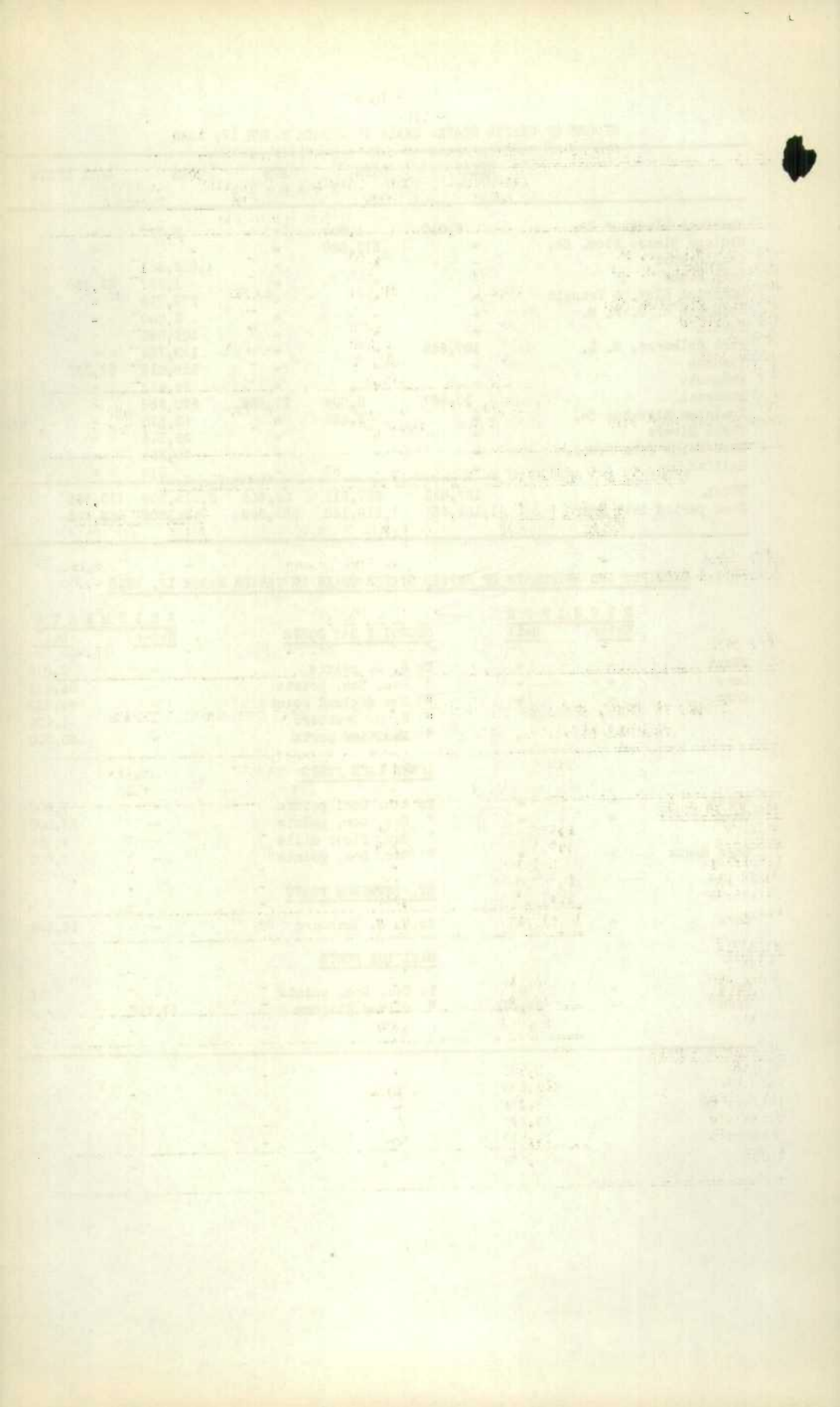
