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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 7, 1939 decreased 2,095,171 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 94,354,140 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 138,798,422 bushels compared with 140,893,593 bushels for the previous week and 44,444,282 bushels for the week ending April 8, 1938. The stocks of 138,798,422 bushels include 11,922,365 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending April 7, 1939 were 137,231,422 bushels compared with 139,064,593 bushels for the previous week and 43,480,382 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 39,520,000; Interior Terminals 15,414,447; Vancouver-New Westminster 9,378,664; Victoria 683,868; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 43,146,165; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 12,417,283 and 8,707,933 bushels respectively.

Increases were indicated at Interior Elevators of 194,600; Vancouver-New Westminster 750,587; Victoria 18,479 and Fort William and Port Arthur of 1,463,762 bushels, while decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 2,135,000 and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 699,516 and 212,357 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 5,749,682 bushels compared with 2,527,446 bushels for the same week a year ago.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,567,000 bushels, a decrease of 262,000 bushels from the previous week when 1,829,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 219,000; Buffalo Afloat 228,000; Erie 348,000; New York 236,000; Albany 512,000 and Philadelphia 24,000 bushels. Decreases in stocks were shown at the following ports: Buffalo 5,000; Buffalo Afloat 187,000; Erie 26,000; New York 1,000; Albany 35,000 and Baltimore 8,000 bushels. Stocks at Philadelphia remain unchanged.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 963,900 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 21,000; Erie 616,000; New York 250,000 and Albany 76,900 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 7, 1939 amounted to 967,996 bushels, a decrease of 142,459 bushels from the previous week when 1,110,455 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,140,163 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending April 7, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 126,501 (393,720); Saskatchewan 328,571 (231,632); Alberta 512,924 (514,811) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-six weeks from August 1, 1938 to April 7, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 41,532,424 (34,844,646); Saskatchewan 106,845,488 (23,900,228); Alberta 112,887,481 (53,222,435) bushels. For the thirty-six weeks ending April 7, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 258,265,393 and 112,361,026 bushels respectively were received from the farms.





OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending April 7, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,298,304 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 145,000 bushels. The total is 1,443,304 bushels compared with 962,631 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 480,673 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 873,201 bushels.

The accumulated totals of imports of wheat into the United States for consumption and milling in bond are adjusted at the end of the month, due to the fact that the United States Department of Domestic and Foreign Commerce revises its weekly figures on a monthly basis.

World shipments for the week ending April 8, 1939 amounted to 10,724,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,513,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,640,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Australian shipments showed slight increases while Argentine shipments were lower by 1,587,000 bushels as compared with the previous week.

During the first thirty-six weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 396,397,000 bushels as compared with only 353,688,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 170,226,000 bushels as compared with 132,408,000 bushels for the same period in 1937-38. Shipments from Argentina were 8.0 million bushels higher for the first thirty-six weeks of the present crop year as compared with the same period last year.
