WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 21, 1939 decreased 1,988,164 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 92,413,495 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 135,893,649 bushels compared with 137,881,813 bushels for the previous week and 43,480,154 bushels for the week ending April 22, 1938. The stocks of 135,893,649 bushels include 11,651,546 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending April 21, 1939 were 134,861,649 bushels compared with 136,741,813 bushels for the previous week and 42,675,254 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 38,065,000; Interior Terminals 15,499,207; Vancouver-New Westminster 10,359,906; Victoria 673,360; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 45,604,646; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 11,215,588 and 8,432,426 bushels respectively.

Decreases were indicated at Western Country Elevators of 765,000; Interior Elevators 90,246; Victoria 82,377 and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 582,474 and 174,053 bushels respectively, while increases were noted at Vancouver of 525,133 and Fort William and Port Arthur 914,218 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 2,798,136 bushels compared with 2,891,569 bushels for the same week a year ago. There were also 1,983,198 bushels of wheat in Transit Lake during the corresponding week in 1938.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,032,000 bushels, a decrease of 108,000 bushels from the previous week when 1,140,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 117,000; Erie 121,000; New York 324,000; Albany 450,000 and Philadelphia 20,000 bushels. Decreases in stocks were shown at the following ports: Buffalo 97,000; Erie 99,000 and Albany 43,000 bushels while increases were noted at New York of 119,000 and Philadelphia 12,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 804,900 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 105,000; Erie 517,000; New York 106,000 and Albany 76,900 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 21, 1939 amounted to 1,290,295 bushels, a decrease of 152,318 bushels from the previous week when 1,442,613 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,108,043 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending April 21, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 189,140 (185,177); Saskatchewan 664,977 (276,581); Alberta 436,178 (646,285) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-eight weeks from August 1, 1938 to April 21, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 41,924,630 (35,836,268); Saskatchewan 108,193,169 (24,391,110); Alberta 120,901,302 (54,381,116) bushels. For the thirty-eight weeks ending April 21, 1939 and the same period in 1938: 271,019,101 and 114,608,494 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending April 21, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,071,120 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 339,000 bushels. The total is 1,410,120 bushels compared with 1,129,389 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 280,731 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 1,063,027 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending April 22, 1939 amounted to 11,333,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,963,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,808,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Australian shipments showed increases while Argentine shipments were lower as compared with the previous week.

During the first thirty-eight weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 418,804,000 bushels as compared with only 375,616,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 176,882,000 bushels as compared with 137,232,000 bushels for the same period in 1937-38. Shipments from Argentina were almost 12 million bushels higher for the first thirty-eight weeks of the present crop year as compared with the same period last year.

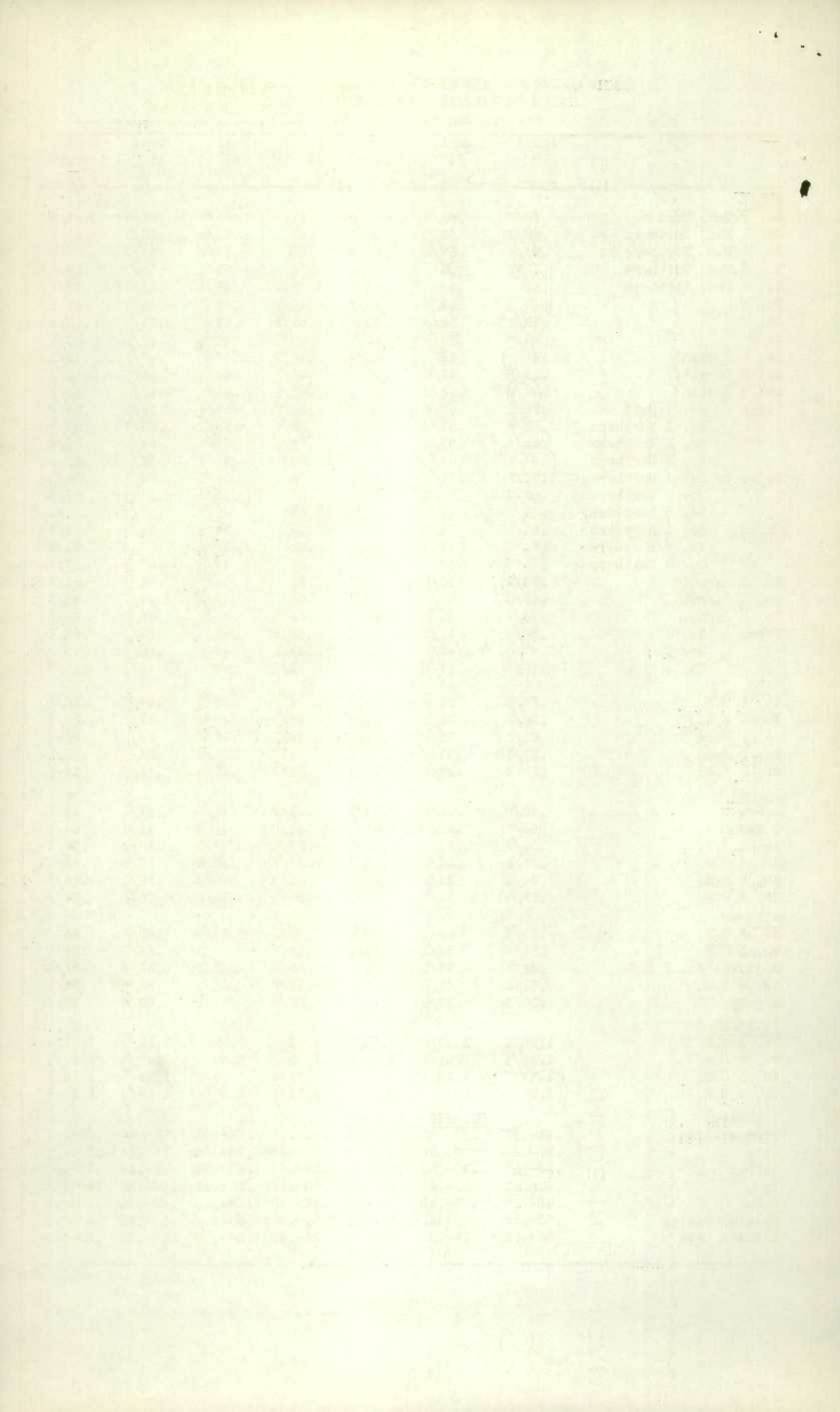
