WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 26, 1938 increased 14,336,609 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 810,790 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1937. The amount in store was reported as 37,668,272 bushels compared with 23,331,663 bushels for the previous week and 38,479,062 bushels for the week ending August 27, 1937. The stocks of 37,668,272 bushels include 10,058,461 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,279,000 bushels, a decrease of 41,000 bushels from the previous week when 1,238,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 121,000; Erie 397,000; New York 180,000; New York Afloat 572,000 and Albany 9,000 bushels. Decreases in the stocks were noted at Buffalo of 48,000 and Erie 193,000 bushels, while increases were shown at New York of 145,000 and New York Afloat 137,000 bushels. The wheat stocks at Albany remained the same as those of the previous week.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 2,740,020 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 136,020; Buffalo 185,000; New York 1,747,000 and Albany 672,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada totalled 211,306 bushels compared with 854,539 bushels for the previous year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada for the week ending August 26, 1938 were **36,**389,272 bushels compared with 22,093,663 bushels for the previous week and **35,742,042** bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 12,104,000; Interior Terminals 1,314,412; Vancouver-New Westminster 67,355; Churchill 11,820; Fort William and Port Arthur 8,373,534; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 1,998,582 and 2,665,297 bushels respectively.


Increases were shown in the stocks over those of the previous week at the following elevators: Western Country Elevators 6,697,000; Interior Terminals 24,497; Fort William and Port Arthur 3,943,904 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 72,179 bushels, while decreases were noted at Vancouver-New Westminster of 5,705 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 568,725 bushels.

Wheat in transit by rail amounted to 8,519,260 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 773,093 bushels for the week ending August 26, 1938 compared with 5,776,590 and 985,019 bushels respectively for the same period last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 26, 1938 amounted to 14,706,187 bushels, an increase of 9,652,781 bushels over the previous week when 5,053,406 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 8,348,169 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending August 26, 1938 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 8,899,851 (5,481,313); Saskatchewan 4,333,433 (1,832,558); Alberta 1,472,903 (1,034,298) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the four weeks from August 1, 1938 to August 26, 1938 as compared with the same period in 1937 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1937: Manitoba 12,701,851 (8,281,715); Saskatchewan 5,953,737 (3,569,050); Alberta 2,871,161 (2,073,408) bushels. For the four weeks ending August 26, 1938 and the same period in 1937, 21,526,570 and 13,924,173 bushels respectively were received from tho farms.



OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending August 26, 1938 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,619,955 bushels and the imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 5,000 bushels totalling 1,624,955 bushels, as compared with 1,488,307 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 136,648 bushels, and when compared with the same period in 1937 an increase of 46,968 bushels.



The following table shows the world shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first four weeks of the present crop year. (Broomhall's figures).

World shipments for the week ending August 27, 1938 amounted to 12,414,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,867,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,832,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed decrease of 697,000 bushels as compared with the previous week, while Argentine and Australian shipments showed increases of 974,000 and 462,000 bushels respectively.


During the first four weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 47,585,000 bushels as compared with only 29,088,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 16,587,000 bushels as compared with 11,992,000 bushels for the same period in 1937. For the first four weeks of the present crop year Russia shipped 12,472,000 bushels as compared with 728,000 bushels for the same weeks last year.
