WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 5, 1939 increased 503,035 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 95,935,807 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 135,418,800 bushels compared with 134,915,765 bushels for the previous week and 39,482,993 bushels for the week ending May 6, 1938. The stocks of 135,418,800 bushels include 10,412,049 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending May 5, 1939 were 134,348,800 bushels compared with 134,084,765 bushels for the previous week and 38,776,993 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 32,724,000; Interior Terminals 15,201,798; Vancouver-New Westminster 10,534,114; Victoria 715,342; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 39,959,760; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 9,044,571 and 7,173,562 bushels respectively.

Decreases were indicated at Western Country Elevators of 3,601,000; Fort William and Port Arthur 5,859,028 and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 1,513,901 and 1,096,401 bushels respectively, while increases were noted at Interior Elevators of 9,224; Vancouver-New Westminster 13,514 and Victoria 32,885 bushels.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 7,962,947 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 8,829,326 bushels for the week ending May 5, 1939, compared with 2,914,474 and 2,101,215 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES


Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,070,000 bushels, an increase of 239,000 bushels over the previous week when 831,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 113,000; Erie 114,000; Chicago 381,000; New York 138,000 and Albany 324,000 bushels. Decreases in stocks were shown at the following ports: Buffalo 4,000; Erie 4,000; New York 56,000 and Albany 78,000 bushels, while Chicago increased 381,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 706,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 207,000; Erie 427,000 and New York 72,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 5, 1939 amounted to 815,874 bushels,a decrease of 264,043 bushels from the previous week when 1,079,917 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 688,700 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending May 5, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 127,263 (123,982); Saskatehewan 395,206 (196,002); Alberta 293,405 (368,716) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty weeks from August 1, 1938 to May 5, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows: figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 42,155,925 (36,287,802); Saskatchewan 109,164,303 (24,853,944); Alberta 121,723,100 (55,531,628) bushels. For the forty weeks ending May 5, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 273,043,328 and 116,465,314 bushels respectively were received from the farms.



OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending May 5, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,567,664 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 251,000 bushels. The total is 1,818,664 bushels compared with 996,188 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 822,476 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 1,188,866 bushels.



World shipments for the week ending May 6, 1939 amounted to 10,933,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 11,603,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,000,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase of 494,000 bushels as compared with the previous week while shipments from Argentina and Australia were lower.

During the first forty weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 441,392,000 bushels as compared with only 398,224,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 184,842,000 bushels as compared with 145,152,000 bushels for the same period in 1937-38. Shipments from Argentina were almost 17.2 million bushels higher for the first forty weeks of the present crop year as compared with the same period last year, while Australian shipments were lower by 21.6 million bushels.
