WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 12, 1939 decreased 6,295,827 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 90,790,095 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 129,122,973 bushels compared with 135,418,800 bushels for the previous week and 38,332,878 bushels for the week ending May 13, 1938. The stocks of 129,122,973 bushels include 9,978,815 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending May 12, 1939 were 128,142,973 bushels compared with 134,348,800 bushels for the previous week and 37,816,878 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 24,613,000; Interior Terminals 15,427,209; Vancouver-New Westminster 10,308,696; Victoria 682,234; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 37,217,946; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 13,079,694 and 7,172,493 bushels respectively.

Decreases were indicated at Western Country Elevators of 8,111,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 225,418; Victoria 33,108; Fort William and Port Arthur 2,741,814; and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,069 bushels, while increases were noted at Interior Elevators and Eastern Elevators of 225,411 and 4,035,123 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 11,118,742 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 6,309,579 bushels for the week ending May 12, 1939 compared with 2,357,268 and 2,805,874 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 980,000 bushels, a decrease of 90,000 bushels from the previous week when 1,070,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 310,000; Erie 110,000; New York 141,000 and Albany 219,000 bushels. Decreases in stocks were shown at the following ports: Erie 4,000; Chicago 381,000 and Albany 105,000 bushels, while increases were noted at Buffalo 197,000; Erie Canal 200,000; and New York 3,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 516,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 116,000; Erie 342,000 and New York 58,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 12, 1939 amounted to 906,674 bushels, an increase of 15,162 bushels over the previous week when 891,512 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 539,103 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending May 12, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 145,332 (161,234); Saskatchewan 480,206 (169,809); Alberta 281,136 (208,060) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-one weeks from August 1, 1938 to May 12, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows: figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 42,307,861 (36,449,036); Saskatchewan 109,676,100 (25,023,753); Alberta 122,041,679 (55,531,628) bushels. For the forty-one weeks ending May 12, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 274,025,640 and 117,004,417 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending May 12, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,239,174 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 154,000 bushels. The total is 3,393,174 bushels compared with 1,818,664 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 1,574,510 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 2,683,819 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending May 13, 1939 amounted to 12,323,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,933,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,592,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase of 1,722,000 bushels as compared with the previous week while shipments from Argentina and Australia were again lower.

During the first forty-one weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 453,712,000 bushels as compared with only 408,816,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 190,802,000 bushels as compared with 148,816,000 bushels for the same period in 1937-38. Shipments from Argentina were over 19.4 million bushels higher for the first forty-one weeks of the present crop year as compared with the same period last year, while Australian shipments were lower by 25.1 million bushels.

The study was conducted in a randomized controlled trial. The treatment group received the intervention, while the control group received a placebo. The response rate was measured as the percentage of subjects who completed the study without dropping out. The results showed that the treatment group had a significantly higher response rate than the control group.

The results of the study indicate that the treatment is effective in increasing the response rate. This finding is consistent with previous research, which has shown that the treatment improves outcomes in this population. The study was limited by a small sample size and a short duration of follow-up.

In conclusion, the study demonstrates the effectiveness of the treatment in improving the response rate. Further research is needed to confirm these findings and to explore the underlying mechanisms of the treatment effect.
