WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 19, 1939 decreased 5,520,611 bushels compared with the previous week and increased 87,582,869 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1938. The amount in store was reported as 123,602,362 bushels compared with 129,122,973 bushels for the previous week and 36,019,493 bushels for the week ending May 20, 1938. The stocks of 123,602,362 bushels include 10,199,605 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending May 19, 1939 were 121,617,362 bushels compared with 128,142,973 bushels for the previous week and 35,331,493 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 18,875,000; Interior Terminals 15,546,407; Vancouver-New Westminster 9,840,813; Victoria 609,141; Churchill 2,213,380; Fort William and Port Arthur 37,076,752; Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 14,568,831 and 7,692,226 bushels respectively.

Decreases were indicated at Western Country Elevators of 5,738,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 467,883; Victoria 73,093 and Fort William and Port Arthur 141,194 bushels, while increases were noted at Interior Elevators of 119,198 and Eastern Elevators Lake and Seaboard Ports 1,489,137 and 519,733 bushels respectively.

Wheat in rail transit amounted to 10,258,836 bushels and the amount in transit on the lakes was 4,935,976 bushels for the week ending May 19, 1939 compared with 2,249,244 and 2,761,125 bushels for the same period last year.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,985,000 bushels, an increase of 1,005,000 bushels over the previous week when 980,000 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 460,000; Buffalo Afloat 246,000; Erie 110,000; Erie Canal 525,000; New York 149,000 and Albany 495,000 bushels. Increases in stocks were shown at the following ports: Buffalo 150,000; Buffalo Afloat 246,000; Erie Canal 325,000; New York 8,000 and Albany 276,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 688,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 188,000; Erie 438,000 and New York 62,000 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 19, 1939 amounted to 1,254,722 bushels, an increase of 198,354 bushels over the previous week when 1,056,368 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 605,716 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending May 19, 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 162,740 (220,899); Saskatchewan 636,216 (149,018); Alberta 455,766 (235,799) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-two weeks from August 1, 1938 to May 19, 1939 as compared with the same period in 1938 were as follows: figures within brackets being those for 1938: Manitoba 42,522,657 (36,669,935); Saskatchewan 110,358,485 (25,172,771); Alberta 122,548,914 (55,767,427) bushels. For the forty-two weeks ending May 19, 1939 and the same period in 1938, 275,430,056 and 117,610,133 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending May 19, 1939 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,308,916 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 340,000 bushels. The total is 3,648,916 bushels compared with 3,393,174 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 255,742 bushels and when compared with the same period in 1938 an increase of 2,046,417 bushels.
